To love; not to be in love

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time 4 Nov 2018

Dt 6:2-6 Hebr 7:23-28 Mk 12:28-34

To love God and to love our neighbour—these are the two Great Commandments that this Sunday's gospel text sets out. The various rules in scripture and tradition, including the Ten Commandments, must be "interpreted in light of this twofold yet single commandment of love," as per CCC 2055.

Three points are offered here for our reflection on Christian love.

First, to love is to give of ourselves.

In 1 John 4:8, scripture says that "God is love." Our perfect model for love is thus the cross, where God emptied himself to his people.

In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus gives us an example of loving our neighbour. In Jesus' time, a 'neighbour' would have conventionally been understood to be a member of one's people. A Jew would have been another Jew's neighbour.

But the Good Samaritan goes beyond his own people, beyond his boundaries, beyond himself. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out in *Jesus of Nazareth*: From the *Baptism to the Transfiguration*, the burden of the question shifts: it is no longer about who my neighbour is, it is about who am I a neighbour to.

wrote in The Four Loves, "Divine Gift - love in the man enables him to love what is not naturally lovable: lepers, criminals, enemies, morons, the sulky, the superior, and the sneering... Love himself can work in those who know nothing of him."

Second, to love is to be vulnerable. In helping out the half-dead Jew, the Good Samaritan had to bandage his wounds, bring him to an inn, and even pay for him. This is messy, time-consuming, and expensive. This is what love demands.

In a session on friendship for Catholic students, Fr Mike Schmitz explains the difference between being vulnerable and being transparent. Transparency, he says, is like being in a fish bowl. You let others see into your life from the outside. But vulnerability is letting others into the fishbowl itself. They are not just observing from the outside; they're swimming with you on the inside.

And once people are inside your lives, they can hurt you. Lovers experience heartbreak. Judas betrayed Jesus.

"Love anything, and your heart will certainly be wrung and possibly be broken," writes CS Lewis. But he continues, "If you want to make sure of keeping it intact, you must give your heart to no one, not even to an animal. Wrap it carefully round with hobbies and little luxuries; avoid all

entanglements; lock it up safe in the casket—safe, dark, motionless, airless—it will change. It will not be broken; it will become unbreakable, impenetrable, irredeemable."

Third, loving is an act of the will. The Great Commandments instruct us to *love* (a verb), not to be *in love* (a noun).

Modern culture falsely equates the noun and the verb. Movies and pop songs today tell us that 'love' is about how intensely we feel, how much pleasure we derive, how much happiness we receive. But as Karol Wojtyla (now St John Paul II) wrote in *Love and Responsibility*, "It is impossible to judge the value of a relationship between persons merely from the intensity of their emotions... A very rich and rapid growth of [romantic feelings] may conceal a love which has failed to develop."

Love, in other words, is not romance. But without the feelings, how do we know if we love at all?

Again, CS Lewis has an answer: "Do not waste time bothering whether you 'love' your neighbour; act as if you did. As soon as we do this we find one of the great secrets. When you are behaving as if you loved someone, you will presently come to love him."
