Christ: The "New Centre"

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 18 Nov 2018

Dan 12:1-3 Hebr 10:11-14,18 Mk 13:24-32

Despair, fear and helplessness - these emotions arise when we observe yet another onslaught of flooding, fire, earthquake or tsunami. The frequency of such natural disasters and the increasing uncertainties politically and socially has led many to wonder if indeed the chaotic "time of distress" Jesus speaks of in today's gospel is here (Mk 13:24). We may be sky-gazing to see if "the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness..." - the "signs" of the "end-times" as a quick reading of today's gospel seem to convey.

However, Jesus is not acting as a "seer" nor speaking of "the end of the world" says Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI. Rather, the sun, moon, stars, heaven and earth are Old Testament apocalyptic or endtime images which now have "a new centre" in Jesus himself - in "the mystery of his Person and of his death and Resurrection" (Angelus, 18 Nov 2012).

Pope Emeritus says that the cosmos, by having the finitude of the created order, will also pass away but the Word himself (through whom the whole of creation has come about – Gn 1) and his words to humanity, will never pass away (cf Mk. 13:31). In centering the true cosmic sign now on the glorious "Son of Man" figure who will emerge from the fading created cosmos, Jesus is in fact speaking

of himself and "wishes to prevent his disciples in every epoch from being curious about dates and predictions; he wants instead to provide them... the right way on which to walk, today and in the future, to enter eternal life" (Angelus, 18 Nov 2012).

We receive insights and encouragement to walk this "right way" to eternal life at every Mass through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Every Sunday, the Church invites us to fix our gaze on this "new centre" - this radiant "Son of Man" coming in glory and power in the clouds is Jesus whom we affirm in the Creed, "...will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead". In Holy Communion, we participate in Jesus' resurrected radiance and glory, "...our participation in the Eucharist already gives us a foretaste of Christ's transfiguration of our bodies... our bodies which partake of the Eucharist are no longer corruptible, but possess the hope of the resurrection" (CCC 1000, St. Irenaeus).

Today's Second Reading from Hebrews reminds us that the Eucharist we receive comes from Christ's great gift of love for man by his self-offering on the cross. It is his "one single sacrifice for sins" – our sins which he took upon himself. In his Resurrection and Ascension, he has now "taken his place for ever, at the right hand of God" but has not distanced himself from us for we meet him most intimately at every Mass. Holy Mass is the place for "the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying" – we are the undeserving beneficiaries of Jesus' sacrifice (Hebr 10:11-14).

Let us today recognise ever more deeply that by our baptism and through Holy Communion, Christ is now our strength and power to become the "learned" and virtuous who will be gathered up and saved (Dan 12:3). Being "learned" here refers to having the wisdom and knowledge of God's saving help gained from the prayerful reading of God's Word. St. Isidore of Seville said that when we pray, we talk to God but when we read, God talks to us. Moved by God's love and mercy, may we grow in virtue and charity and inspire others to also turn their gaze to Jesus. Our transformed lives can therefore "[instruct] many in virtue" (Dan 12:3).

"...there is no lack of natural disasters nor, unfortunately, of war and violence" says Pope Emeritus. We can however transform the chaos and distress with our generous offerings and prayers just as Jesus is transforming us and granting us peace. Let us not despair and fear but restore and raise up broken lives – doing this every day until the "Son of Man" comes to gather us and bring us home.


