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The King's Confession

Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 25 Nov 2018


Dan 7:13-14 Rev 1:5-8 Jn 18:33-37

"Yes, I am a king," Jesus confesses (Jn 18:37).

This conversation between Pilate and Jesus, found only in John's Gospel, is a 'confession' in both senses of the word. First, it is a statement that unequivocally sets out an essential religious doctrine that Jesus is King. Second, in a time when the fully human and fully divine nature of Jesus presented an utter novelty, it is an admission that proves Jesus' 'guilt': to the Temple aristocracy, Jesus had blasphemed and therefore had to die.

As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out in Jesus of Nazareth: From the Entrance into Jerusalem to the Resurrection, the Jews' accusation that Jesus claimed to be king was a serious one. During that time, regional kings like Herod had to be legitimated by Rome, who defined and limited their sovereignty. Conversely, claims to kingship without Rome's support threatened the Pax Romana, which justified the death sentence.

To Pilate, however, Jesus' confession was a conundrum. As Roman Governor, Pilate's job was to keep the peace and to quell rebellions. But perhaps the most glaring point of Jesus' confession was what his kingship is *not*: "[His] is not a kingdom of this world." Jesus had no legions and had instigated no uprisings. In other words, Pilate had nothing that



could incriminate Jesus because Pilate knew that Jesus posed no risk to law and order.

In this scene, Pilate thus stands in stark contrast to Jesus. Pilate represents classical worldly power; Jesus' kingdom is not of this world. Pilate is about to commit a crime; Jesus is the 'criminal'. Pilate knows the truth; Jesus is the Truth.

At a deeper level then, beyond the problem of what to do with Jesus, Jesus' confession challenges Pilate's raison d'être. While Pilate derives his authority from power, Jesus' kingship is rooted in truth. As Jesus declared to Pilate, "I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice."

Reflecting on the relationship between truth and power is particularly apt in today's world. We have backpedaled from an age of enlightenment to an age of post-truths, from information to disinformation. As academics such as Jason Stanley wrote in *How Fascism Works*, "A fascist leader can replace truth with power, ultimately lying without consequence."

Indeed, history has shown that tyrants and dictators have always subordinated truth to power, and in fact, wielded power by concealing truth. So did the Sanhedrin when they ignored Jesus' divinity; so did Pilate when he washed his hands off the blood of Jesus' humanity. The conviction of Jesus is thus, ironically, an indictment of both the Jews' spiritual authority and the Romans' worldly authority.

Instead, Jesus' kingship and authority is rooted in the truths of his life, death, and resurrection. As CCC 786 states, "[Jesus] exercises his kingship by drawing all men to himself through his death and resurrection."

For us Christians, we do not want to wash our hands *off* Jesus' blood; like our Second Reading states, we want our sins to be washed *away* by it. Not because we participated in the Crucifixion of our king, but because we participated in his Passion. And then perhaps, when we come face to face with God, we would have been "washed white by the blood of the Lamb" (Rev 7:14).

CATECHISM 2019 REGISTRATION



On November 25, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King in which we recognise the all-embracing authority of Christ as King and Lord of the cosmos. It is fitting that the feast celebrating Christ's kingship is observed right before Advent, when we liturgically wait for the promised Messiah (King).

Unlike secular royalty, Christ's kingship is one of humility and service. Jesus said: "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognise as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:42-45).

The Feast of Christ the King is, as Catholic feasts go, a relatively recent one. It is to remind Catholics (and the world generally) that Jesus Christ is Lord of the Universe, both as God and as Man.

Pope Pius XI announced the feast in his encyclical Quas Primas, which was delivered on December 11, 1925. At the end of the encyclical, he declared that he expected three "blessings" to flow from the celebration of the feast.

First: "Men will doubtless be reminded that the Church, founded by Christ as a perfect society, has a natural and inalienable right to perfect freedom and immunity from the power of the state";

Second: "Nations will be reminded by the annual celebration of this feast that not only private individuals but also rulers and princes are bound to give public honor and obedience to Christ";

Third: "The faithful, moreover, by meditating upon these truths, will gain much strength and courage, enabling them to form their lives after the true Christian ideal."

How is the date of the Feast of Christ the King determined?

In Quas Primas, Pope Pius XI established the celebration of the feast "on the last Sunday of the month of October — the Sunday, which immediately precedes the Feast of All Saints." He tied it to All Saints Day because "before celebrating the triumph of all the

Saints, we proclaim and extol the glory of him who triumphs in all the Saints and in all the Elect." With the revision of the Church's liturgical calendar in 1969 however, Pope Paul VI moved the Feast of Christ the King to the final Sunday of the liturgical year—that is, the last Sunday before the First Sunday of Advent. As such, it is a moveable feast; the date changes every year.
