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Water to Wine

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 20 Jan 2019

Is 62:1-5 1 Cor 12:4-11 In 2:1-11

This Sunday's gospel text centers on the Wedding at Cana, the first public miracle that Jesus performs. We can appreciate the significance of this text by focusing on two key details in the narrative.

The first detail is Jesus' response to Mary: "My hour has not yet come." On one level, this response implies that Jesus does not merely act on his own whims; he acts in harmony with the Father's will and according to the Father's plan.

On another level, Jesus' response foreshadows his "hour"-the moment that Jesus was crucified. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out in Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration, Jesus thus "stamps the miracle of Cana as an anticipation of the [mystery of the Cross], tying the two together intrinsically."

Against the broader context of the wedding event, Jesus' response also points towards the hour of the marriage supper of the Lamb (Rev 19:9). Similarly, Isaiah prophesies in our First Reading that Israel will "have its wedding" and God will rejoice in her just "as the bridegroom rejoices in his bride."

Jesus does the same thing in the Eucharist: he celebrates the marriage feast with us here and now and lifts us out of our own time towards the "hour"

of his glory. As Pope Emeritus puts it, "The promise of the last days enters into the Now."

The **second detail** is the miracle itself: water is turned into wine. The text tells us that this was water meant for "ablutions" i.e. for ritual purification. On the other hand, wine represents feasting—"[it] gives man a taste of the glory of creation" and "allows us to glimpse something of the definitive feast God will celebrate with man," in the words of Pope Emeritus.

Pope Emeritus reflects further that the miracle portrays the fulfillment of the Law in Jesus. "Ritual purification is in the end never sufficient to make man capable of God, to make him really 'pure' for God. Water becomes wine. Man's own efforts now encounter the gift of God, who gives himself and thereby creates the feast of joy that can only be instituted by the presence of God and his gift."

But God is not only present when water is transformed into wine at Cana. As CS Lewis points out in Miracles, God creates the vine which turns water, soil, and sunlight into a juice which will ferment into wine. In Cana, God simply "short-circuit[ed] the process".

In this regard, Lewis concludes that the miracle has "half its effect if it only convinces us that Christ is God: it will have its full effect if whenever we see a vineyard or drink a glass of wine, we remember that here works he who sat at the wedding party in Cana."

Month of the Holy Name of Jesus

For this reason also, God highly exalted him, and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, so that at the name of JESUS every knee will bow, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

(Philippians 2:9-11)

The month of January is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, with January 3rd being the feast of the Holy Name.

Christ's name is chosen in heaven, and the Angel Gabriel announces it when he informs the Blessed Virgin of the incarnation: "Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb and shalt bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus". It is a name that has marvellous implications, for it means "saviour." The very name bespeaks the magnitude of his mission, his infinite love, a love that will cause him to offer himself up for us.

The name of Jesus is the sweetest of all names, and he who bears it is most worthy of all love. He who calls Jesus his friend can be assured that this friend is the most devoted and unselfish of all friends.

Jesus is our all. In his name we may pray to the Father with assurance of being heard. In his name the Church administers all her sacraments. In his name she offers all her prayers and blesses homes, the fields, and the sick. In the name of Jesus she casts out evil spirits, and at the hour of our death bids us, "Go forth, Christian soul." She assures us that whoever shall call upon this name will be saved. When our soul has departed this life to seek its eternal home, the Church asks in the name of Jesus, "Eternal rest give unto him, O Lord."

Another good practice that we could take to heart during this Month of the Holy Name of Jesus is the recitation of the **Jesus Prayer**.

This penitential prayer very simply says, "Lord Jesus Christ Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner," which can be repeated on a prayer rope or Jesus Beads just as the Hail Mary is prayed on the Rosary.

The Jesus Prayer

Very early on, Christians came to understand that the very name of Jesus had great power, and the recitation of his name was itself a form of prayer. This short prayer is a combination of that early Christian practice and the prayer offered

by the publican in the parable of the pharisee and the publican (Luke 18:9-14).

Origin of the "Jesus Prayer"

The derivation of the power behind the invocation of Jesus' name comes from Saint Paul who wrote, "At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord." (Phil 2:10)

Saint Paul urges you to "pray without ceasing," and this prayer is one of the best ways to start doing so. It takes only a few minutes to memorize, after which you can recite it whenever you remember to do so. According to Christian belief, if you fill the empty moments of your day with the Holy Name of Jesus, you will keep your thoughts focused on God and grow in his grace.

This month, why not take a few minutes to memorize the Jesus Prayer, and pray it during those moments of the day when you are between activities, or traveling, or simply taking a rest? Keeping Christ's Name always on our lips is a good way to ensure that we draw ever nearer to him.

It's a shame that the lovable name of Jesus, so powerful and salvific, is so often invoked in vain or in blasphemy. To more greatly honour the name of Jesus ensure that you and your family avoid making this mistake yourselves, and, whenever you hear the name of Jesus said in vain or blasphemed, make up for the sacrilege by praising the name of Jesus either in your heart, or even better, out loud. Jesus is the King of Kings, and this small act of love for his name will not go unrewarded by him.
