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Lord, Liar or Lunatic?

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time 3 Feb 2019

Jer 1:4-5, 17-19 1 Cor 12:31-13:13 Lk 4:21-30

Today's Gospel is a continuation Sunday's from last reading. After proclaiming the Isaiah text concerning God's promise to send an anointed or Spirit-filled servant to establish a glorious new Israel, the synagogue congregation was filled with admiration over Jesus' "gracious words" (hoi logoi tēs charitos - literally "words of salvation"). This admiration, however, quickly turned into scorn as they rejected Jesus' claim to be the anointed messiah of Isaiah's prophecy. Despite the miracles worked in Capernaum that proved Jesus' divine origin, those in the synagogue saw Jesus as just "Joseph's son" (Lk 4:22). In response to their disbelief, Jesus recalled the times Israel had refused God and therefore could not receive the miracles of life and restoration. These miracles were granted instead to the Gentile widow of Zarephath and the Syrian, Naaman, who demonstrated faith, obedience and hope (Lk 4:23-27).

Now, right before them in the Nazareth synagogue was the Word himself – God's Son and their messiah – and Israel again, would be bypassed because he was not the exalted military figure they had expected but a lowly carpenter's son.

Addressing this passage, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI posed this question, "...why ever did Jesus want to stir up this antagonism? At the outset the people admired him and he might perhaps have been able to obtain a certain consensus...But this is exactly the point: Jesus did not come to seek the agreement of men and women but rather - as he was to say to Pilate in the end - 'to bear witness to the truth'. The true prophet does not obey others as he does God, and puts himself at the service of the truth, ready to pay in person. It is true that Jesus was a prophet of love, but love has a truth of its own. Indeed, love and truth are two names of the same reality, two names of God" (Angelus, 3 Feb 2013).

Today, many people acknowledge Jesus' historicity but find themselves unsure about Christianity's claim and adoration of him as Lord and God.

In his book "Mere Christianity", atheistturned-Christian apologist, CS Lewis, wrote with zealous fervour that it is "foolish" to praise Jesus for being "a great moral teacher" and not accept his claim to be God, "A man who was merely a man and said that sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic - on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg - or else he would be the Devil of Hell [i.e. liar]. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronizing nonsense about his

being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us."

Lewis' own remarkable conversion came from his examination of the scriptural and historical evidence about Jesus, "Now it seems to me obvious that He was neither a lunatic nor a fiend: and consequently however strange or terrifying or unlikely it may seem, I have to accept the view that He was and is God". Lewis' argument for Jesus' divinity is often referred to as "Lewis' Trilemma" or the "Lord, Liar or Lunatic" argument.

Today in Church, we are before Jesus in much the same way as those in the Nazareth synagogue. Jesus was rejected then. May we be enraptured and grateful today as we encounter Jesus' tenderness - he knew us even before we were born and has entrusted to us the mission to bring God's love and mercy to others. This is a mission we are capable of fulfilling because the gift of the Spirit of love has been poured into us at our Baptism (cf Jer 1:5; 1 Cor 13:13).

Not liar. Not lunatic. Jesus is truly our Redeemer, Saviour, Lord and God!

HOLY HOUR


Come spend some time with our Lord at Holy Hour, on **Thu 7 Feb, 8.30pm** in the main church.

Covenant Ritual For Our L10s



On 26 Jan, 52 L10 (Secondary 4) teens participated in their second covenant ritual in preparation to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in May. The covenant ritual is a 2-part series of paraliturgies that recall the Baptismal graces conferred through the symbols of water and light.

This second covenant ritual reaffirms that we are called to be the light of the world (Matt 5:14), a light that shines in the darkness (John 1:5). During the paraliturgy, parents and godparents symbolically handed on a candle to their teen, lit from the Christ candle, in an outward gesture of handing the light of faith on to the next generation. On behalf of our SFX community, these parents and godparents, affirmed our hope for these teens, and our desire to continue praying for them and journeying with them as disciples making disciples.

The Catechetical Ministry of SFX urges all parishioners to pray for our L10 teens as they grow closer to their confirmation. We pray that they will continue to cling to the faith of our fathers, abide in Christ and become proud disciples of the community. Amen!

The RCIA Retreat - Our Treasure



"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it" - Matthew 13:44-46

"Where your treasure is, there, your heart will also be" – was the theme of the RCIA Retreat for 39 catechumens and candidates held at the Retreat House of Church of Immaculate Heart of Mary from 25 to 27 Jan 2019.

During the retreat, the participants were introduced to prayer, from set prayers to having a conversation with God. They also learned to listen to what God was telling them and were encouraged to reflect on their journey, their search for the treasure, the obstacles along the way and how God is also reaching out to them. The sessions were interlaced with praise and worship, small group sharings as well as night walk activities. It was evident, especially during the night walk, that the Holy Spirit touched many retreatants. For some, it was baggages/obstacles they were unaware of and holding on to. For others, it made them more convicted that this is the journey they had been searching for.

For Sandra Lim, the retreat "...far exceeded my expectations – bountiful food, meaningful sharing and many opportunities for prayer and worship, helping me deepen my faith through the leadership of the facilitators and fellowship with other retreatants. Being here has also given me the chance to quieten my heart and mind, allowing God to speak to me. I'm truly blessed to have the opportunity to attend this retreat." Another catechumen, William Tan, shared that "the retreat was an enriching experience." In his search to understand more about the Catholic faith, he was heartened to learn that Jesus was in turn searching for him. The retreat was fulfilling as it gave him a deeper perception of what faith is about. "I appreciate the time and effort put in by the RCIA service team as well as the contribution by the group of highly energetic young people from BASIC and 1Cor12...It was a memorable retreat for me."

This retreat was jointly organized by BASIC, 1Cor12 and the RCIA ministry. The whole SFX community plus an intercessory team were also involved, praying for the participants. Indeed, it was a meaningful, rewarding and Spirit-filled experience for all. Thanks be to God.
