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Loving your Enemies

7th Sunday in Ordinary Time 24 Feb 2019

1 Sam 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 1 Cor 15:45-49 Lk 6:27-38

In today's gospel, Jesus challenges us, "love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you" (Lk 6:27-28). He also challenges us to offer our other cheek to the one who strikes us.

But who are our enemies? Are our enemies those who cause us pain and suffering; betray us; present obstacles to our aspirations in life; differ in opinions from us in our workplaces and even in our church communities and ministries?

We may find that we could even be perceiving some of our loved ones as "enemies"! Why is this so?

Jean Vanier, a Canadian Catholic philosopher, theologian and humanitarian, who founded L'Arche, an international community in 37 countries for people with developmental disabilities, shared a deeply personal and shocking discovery in his book, "From Brokenness to Community".


He wrote, "there were immense forces of darkness and hatred within my own heart. At particular moments of fatigue or stress, I saw forces of hate rising up inside me, and the capacity to hurt someone who was weak was provoking me! That, I think, was what caused me the most pain: to discover who I really am, and to realize that

maybe I did not want to know who I really was! I did not want to admit all the garbage inside me. And then I had to decide whether I would just continue to pretend that I was okay and throw myself into hyperactivity, projects where I could forget all the garbage and prove to others how good I was."

He finally came to the understanding that "...the important thing is to become conscious of those forces in us and to work at being liberated from them and to discover that the worst enemy is inside our own hearts not outside."

When Jesus challenges us to pray for our "enemies", it is not so much that our "enemies" will change but rather, our perception of whom we have perceived as "enemies" will also change. By praying for our "enemies", an interior gaze of ourselves changes too, so that we will not only love the ones who hurt us but more importantly, be able to love and embrace the great good that God has created every man for.

What does it really mean to "offer our cheek to the one who strikes us"? Does it mean that, we, like doormats, allow our aggressors to continue to mistreat us? Bishop Robert Barron, an Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, once shared that in response to our aggressor's aggression, instead of either flight or fight, we adopt a third way: "If someone strikes you on the right cheek, turn and give him the other. No one in Jesus' time would have used the unclean left hand for any kind of social interaction. Therefore, to strike someone on the



right cheek was to hit him with the back of the hand, and this was a gesture of contempt, reserved for slaves and social inferiors ... He thereby signals to the aggressor that he refuses to live in that person's spiritual and psychological space. And he mirrors back the aggressor's aggression, shaming him into self-awareness and prompting conversion."

On the streets of Calcutta, Saint Teresa of Calcutta was holding a starving child by the hand while on the way to a bakery. She begged the baker for some bread for the child, but the baker spat full in her face. She took a firm look at the baker and said, "That was for me, now can you give something for the child?" In the final analysis, the "enemies" of our lives are not meant to make our lives difficult, though it may appear to be, but rather, they are meant to help us grow to become mature Catholic disciples. As expressed in one of Michael Smith's songs, "Sovereign Over Us", "Even what the enemy means for evil, you turn it for our good, you turn it for our good and for your glory."

Parish Renovation Update

Please note that there is a change of access to Convent of Our Lady of Good Council. The entrance is now from the glass door in the children's playground.




COLUMBARIUM

Please follow the directional signages and instructions by the wardens. Thank you for all your understanding.

















TOAE LOOK ENEWIES
