"Don't sin anymore"

5th Sunday of Lent 7 Apr 2019

Is 43:16-21 Phil 3:8-14 Jn 8:1-11

We have finally arrived at the last Sunday in Lent.

On "Spy Wednesday" in ten days' time, the day we remember Judas' visit to the chief priests to betray Jesus, the liturgical colour of purple which symbolises repentance, will be worn for the last time this Lent. The liturgical colour changes on Maundy Thursday to white which is a symbol for light. It reminds us of our purity and innocence which has been restored by Jesus through our baptism into him. We have been adopted as God's children in Christ. We have been made "children of light" to expose the "fruitless deeds of darkness" in this world (cf Eph 5:8,11).

What are we to do, however, if we find we have let Lent slip by? For whatever reasons, we may not have persevered in deeper prayer, fasting and almsgiving or self-sacrifice – and now there is regret. The liturgy for this last Sunday in Lent affirms us that even at this "late" juncture, it is still a good time to "start" Lent and be more open to God!

The first reading reminds us that we are chosen by God (cf Is 43:20). He has chosen us to be "formed" in his love and mercy just as he had chosen the ancient Israelites. Isaiah recalls how God had delivered the Israelites from Egyptian slavery into the Promised Land but because they did not keep God's commandments and adopted


pagan practices and worship, Isaiah prophesied that God will allow their unfaithful alliances to lead them into a 70-year captivity in Babylon. In this time, Judah will realise their erroneous ways and God will then enable their return to Judah to try again to live in fidelity as God's chosen people (cf Ez 1:1-2). These events came to pass between 597-520 BC. The responsorial psalm in which Israel praises God for delivering Zion from bondage vindicates God's wisdom in letting the Babylonian captivity take its course. The long exile had borne the fruit of fidelity God had intended (cf Ps 125).

This was not to last however. By the time Jesus came, the Temple authorities had turned worship into a legalistic burden with the law being interpreted for their own purposes. In today's gospel, the scribes and Pharisees, knowing Jesus' patience with "tax collectors and sinners" (Mt 11:19), wanted to trap Jesus by dragging before him a woman they had caught in adultery. If Jesus spoke against her stoning which was prescribed by Moses, he would be disobeying the Mosaic Law; if he allowed the woman to be stoned, he would be breaking the Roman law which alone had prerogative over capital punishment.

Jesus responds to their heartless persistence by writing something on the ground. He then says to them, "If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her". One by one, beginning with the eldest, the scribes and Pharisees went away and Jesus was left alone with the woman (cf Jn 8:7-9). St Augustine describes this moment as "misera et Misericordia" – wretchedness and Mercy. lesus then addresses the woman,

"Has no one condemned you?...Neither do I condemn you...go away, and don't sin anymore" (Jn 8:11). Jesus' words, according to St Augustine, reveals his "condemnation" of sin but love and mercy for the sinner, "The Lord did also condemn, but condemned sins, not man. For if he were a patron of sin, he would say, 'neither will I condemn you; go, live as you will; be secure in my deliverance; however much you sin, I will deliver you from all punishment'. He said not this" (Commentary on John's Gospel, tract. 33, 6).

Knowing that sin offends God and separates us from him, and knowing how he loves and wants to "form" us (cf Isa 43), let us place our wretchedness and sins before Jesus in the Sacrament of Reconciliation today. There will be no condemnation – *misera et Misericordia* – our wretchedness before his great Mercy. Jesus will urge us to live anew as the "children of light" we are meant to be – "Go...don't sin anymore".

LIVING IN THE LIFE OF THE SPIRIT

Our Secondary 4 brothers and sisters from SFX and Church of St Bernadette participated in a combined-parish Confirmation Retreat held from 22 to 24 Mar. Themed "Life in the Spirit", the retreat was held at the Church of the Transfiguration. Four of them have shared with us what moved and inspired them during these three days.

"I came to this retreat with reservations – an unfamiliar church, worries about life outside of church, and my lack of certainty of my relationship with God... How was I supposed to know whether I was ready for confirmation? Then, the outpouring happened. Think of a dark room covered in carpets, lit only by the light of candles and the monstrance. Songs of Praise and Worship, worming into and resonating through my soul and my bones. Rhythmic chanting in God's language as the facilitators prayed over us. When I looked upon the Eucharist in Father Brian's hands, it took my breath away. During reconciliation, I poured out my worries to the priest, and later as I stared into the monstrance, I felt all my masks chip away and fall until I saw only myself looking back at me. During this retreat, I may not have shaken. I may not have been moved to tears. I may not have been overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit and fallen. Yet, this does not diminish the lightness I felt. I know now that I am blessed by a love beyond human comprehension and that no matter how I'm terrified, no matter what challenges I face, the Trinity is with me and supporting me in whatever I do."

"Coming into this retreat, I was lost, broken, empty and so far away from God. I was so blind to love around me, and my life was filled with darkness. All my days, I never realised that I have always been held in his hands and his embrace. Through this retreat, Jesus opened my eyes and filled my empty heart with his great love. Despite my imperfections, he never ceased to shower me with his love, and he accepts and loves me for who I am. Truly, Jesus is the light that burns in the darkness. His love has set my heart ablaze. I am so thankful for receiving and experiencing the Holy Spirit. He set a fire in my soul, that I cannot contain and control. During the outpouring of the Spirit session, I felt at peace and loved. When the Holy Eucharist was brought in front of my face and the facilitators prayed over me in tongues, I could hear the Holy Spirit speaking to me, and I saw Jesus standing right in front of me. As my right arm began to tremble and tears gushed out of my eyes, I felt so vulnerable and unworthy to be standing in front of my Saviour and Redeemer. Pouring out my heart to him, I heard his voice. I felt his love surround me and felt the Holy Spirit renewing my soul. This retreat has really blessed me with the Holy Spirit and brought me back to the lover of my soul."



"Wandering into this retreat, I felt stressed, empty and uncertain. Stressed because of school, empty because of exhaustion and uncertain due to my worries about whether I would receive Jesus and the Holy Spirit during the retreat. As the sessions, adoration and masses went by, I started to connect more with God and his word, learning that confirmation was just the start of my catechetical journey, and not the end. The teachings of the sessions echoed through me, that we are called by the Heavenly Father to go out and spread the good news to the world, as well as to continue to live in his ways and be like him. I realised and learnt that being a Catholic was so much more

than just attending catechism sessions, bible sharings, and going to church for an hour on Sundays.

Although these things are the least we can do to initiate our journey as children of God, I feel that God has given me the capability and the resources to do so much more than just that. Right now, I am but a small seed which has just grown its roots in the rich soil of God's presence, and my journey to become a disciple is far from complete. I want to strive to be more Christ-like and spread his good word to those around me."
