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Of Farewells and Greetings

6th Sunday of Easter 26 May 2019

Ac 15:1-2, 22-29 Rev 21:10-14, 22-23 Jn 14:23-29

This Sunday's gospel text is taken from what biblical scholars call Jesus' Farewell Discourse—Chapters 14 to 17 in the Gospel of John. In this series of texts, Jesus addresses his disciples just after the Last Supper but before his Passion begins at the Garden of Gethsemane.

But liturgically, we are in Eastertide. Why, then, is our Sunday Gospel from the Farewell Discourse?

Let us first re-visit Easter itself. On the day that Jesus rose from the dead, the disciples had locked the door of the room that they were in, for fear of the Jews (Jn 20:19). They had given up everything to follow Jesus; now that he had died, they doubted and feared.

But Jesus entered through the locked doors, stood among them and in the midst of their fears, and greeted them, "Peace be with you." After showing them his hands and side, he said to them again, "Peace be with you."

In Jewish tradition, greeting another with *shalom* is common enough. However, the peace that Jesus' appearance brings is wholly unique. It is a peace borne out of the knowledge that the Lord is risen and that our salvation is in Him. It is a peace that Jesus bequeathed his disciples even before his Passion began in Gethsemane —

"a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you" (as per this Sunday's gospel).

Easter thus fulfills Jesus' promise in his Farewell Discourse. In then-Pope Benedict XVI's address at St Peter's Square in April 2012, he said, the "common greeting... now acquires new significance because it brings about an inner change; it is the Easter greeting that enables the disciples to overcome all fear... By then it was obvious that it was not only a greeting. It was a gift, the gift that the Risen One wants to offer his friends [emphasis in original]."

Another element ties Jesus' Farewell Discourse and his post-resurrection greetings together. In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus promises his disciples that his Father will send the Holy Spirit in Jesus' name. In Jesus' first appearance to his disciples, he breathes

on them and says to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." (Jn 20:22)

Just as Elijah recognised the Lord in the gentle whisper (see 1 Kgs 19:12), so have the masters of discernment counseled that peace is a mark of the Holy Spirit. In *Weeds Among the Wheat*, Thomas Green S.J. wrote that the Lord "always speaks in peace." This is a peace that indicates the presence of the Holy Spirit, a peace that arises from doing God's will, a peace the world cannot give.

As we prepare for the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, let us remember that the Holy Spirit is present in our lives, even as Jesus is no longer physically with us. Let us allow the Holy Spirit to work in us, bringing about the peace that the world cannot give. Let us find that peace in the Risen Lord, and in knowing that our salvation is in him.

Confirmation 2019

What is your hope for the world? What is your dream?

The sacraments are important tenets in our lives. They presuppose our faith and with words and ritual elements, they nourish, strengthen and express it (CCC 1123). On Sun 19 May, 55 teens from our parish received the sacrament of confirmation and were anointed with chrism oil by Archbishop Goh. As one phase of their 10-year journey ends (the catechetical programme of 10 years from age 6 to 16) and another begins, this question was asked of them, "What is your hope for the world tomorrow? What is your dream?" We spoke to a few of them and share their responses below.



As we celebrate with them, our parish community join in prayers and fervent hope that they will continue to keep this fire within them burning bright and infuse all those they encounter with the gifts they have been entrusted with.
