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### That We May Be One

7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter 2 Jun 2019

Ac 7:55-60 Rev 22:12-14, 16-17, 20 Jn 17:20-26

When we label ourselves as "traditionalists" or "liberals", compare religious orders or favour certain priests or nuns, we may be behaving just like the Corinthians chided by St Paul for saying, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos" (1 Cor 3:4). Both Paul and Apollos were undoubtedly admirable but as St Paul pointed out to the Corinthians, their extreme devotion was "unspiritual": "What is Apollos and what is Paul? They are servants who brought the faith to you...I did the planting, Apollos did the watering, but God made things grow. Neither the planter nor the waterer matters: only God who makes things grow" (1 Cor 3:5-7).

Perhaps Jesus foresaw with deep sadness these "unspiritual" factions and the subsequent divisions in his Church when we read in today's Gospel that he made a heart-rending prayer to God the Father that all his disciples for all time "may be one" (Jn 17:21). We, the Church, exists in order to evangelize that is our deepest identity (cf Evangelii Nuntiandi, 14). How can our faith be authentically credible if there is so much disunity within the Church? The bond of love is essential to our evangelization for Jesus himself said, "by this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (In 13:35). Our missionary and evangelical efforts

would have been in vain without love. Certainly it is not our missionary or evangelical competence that reaches the heart of the non-Christians but the deep and unbreakable communion we show each other as Jesus' disciples.


Differences in doctrine, discipline or church structure have led to deep divisions in the one Church that Jesus established. Since the Great Schism or East-West Schism of 1054 which saw the break in communion between the Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox churches, further rifts have occurred. In an effort to restore unity, Pope St Paul VI promulgated the Decree on Ecumenism, Unitatis Redintegratio (Latin for "Restoration of Unity") at the Second Vatican Council. This decree was largely influenced by a French Dominican, Cardinal Yves Marie-Joseph Congar, who discovered his personal vocation in ecclesiology and ecumenism during his pre-ordination retreat meditating on Jesus' priestly prayer for unity (Jn 17 - today's gospel).

Fundamental to restoring unity is the need for remorse over the divisions, "There can be no ecumenism worthy of the name without a change of heart. For it is from renewal of the inner life of our minds, from self-denial and an unstinted love that desires of unity take their rise and develop in a mature way. We should therefore pray to the Holy Spirit for the grace to be genuinely self-denying, humble, gentle in the service of others, and to have an attitude of brotherly generosity..." (UR7).

We may find these attributes so difficult to pray for especially when challenged or persecuted. Perhaps that is why the Church offers to us today St Stephen's prayer of forgiveness for his executioners, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them" (Ac 7:60). St Stephen's capacity to forgive came from being "filled with the Holy Spirit" and being in the glory of God – beholding Jesus at God's right hand (cf Ac 7:55).

This is the blessed place which we must desire for all to arrive at. Our gift of faith is not a private matter for ourselves alone and it is also not simply "the imitation of [Christ's] virtues...living in this world, as far as we are able, as Christ lived...but it is a journey that has a destination. And the destination is the right hand of the Father...eternal life at the right hand of the Father in communion with Christ" (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, *I Believe in One God, 154*).

Having celebrated the Ascension of our Lord this past Thursday, may we desire with renewed fervour the outpouring of his Spirit of love and unity on us at Pentecost. Filled with his Spirit, may we strive to be one people of God bearing each other through the gates into the city where Christ awaits us to remain always in his glory (cf Rev 22:14, Jn 17:24).

Ever since the internet first became available, the Church has always sought to promote its use in the service of the encounter between persons, and of solidarity among all. If the Internet represents an extraordinary possibility of access to knowledge, it is also true that it has proven to be one of the areas most exposed to disinformation, distortion of facts and damage to interpersonal relationships.

We need to recognise how social networks, on the one hand, help us to better connect, and assist one another, but on the other, lend themselves to the manipulation of personal data, aimed at obtaining political or economic advantages, without due respect for the person.

#### We are members one of another

Like the world wide web, human relations are also tied in a web of interconnectedness of a community. A community is that much stronger if it is cohesive, supportive, and brings about feelings of trust.

St Paul describes the Church as members of one body, "Therefore, putting away falsehood, speak the truth, each to his neighbour, for we are members one of another" (Eph 4:25). Being members one of another is the profound motivation with which the Apostle invites us to put away falsehood and speak the truth. As Christians, we all recognise ourselves as members of the one body whose head is Christ. This helps us not to see people as potential threats, but to consider even our enemies as persons.

God is not Solitude, but Communion; he is Love, and therefore communication, because love always communicates. By virtue of our being created in the image and likeness of God who is communion, we carry forever in our hearts the longing for living in communion, for belonging to a community.

This thus calls on all of us to invest in relationships, and to affirm the interpersonal nature of our humanity, including in and through social network. All the more so, we Christians are called to manifest that communion which marks our identity as believers.

As such, the internet should be used as a resource for communion. If a family uses the internet to be more connected, to then meet at the table and look into each other's eyes, then it is a resource. If a church community coordinates its activity through online networks, and then celebrates the Eucharist together, then it is a resource. If the internet becomes an opportunity to share stories and experiences of beauty or suffering, in order to pray together and together seek out the good to rediscover what unites us, then it is a resource.

The Church herself is a network woven together by Eucharistic communion, where unity is based not on "likes", but on the truth, on the "Amen", by which each one clings to the Body of Christ, and welcomes others.

Let us, on this 53rd World Communications Day, take heed of our actions and speech online, and offline, and use the internet as a means to strengthen the Body of Christ.
