Costly Intentional Discipleship

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time 30 Jun 2019

1 Kgs 19:16, 19 - 21 Gal 5:1, 13 - 18 Lk 9:51 - 62

In today's gospel, Jesus reminds us of the demands of following him – a following which would be "costly" to us wherever he may lead us to. However, if we allow ourselves to be led by the Holy Spirit, we will not only experience the joy of sonship, but also the freedom of a life of grace (cf. Rom 8:14, Gal 5:18).

Although there are approximately 1.2 billion baptised Catholics worldwide, many are sacramentalised but not evangelised as Sherry A. Weddell, the author of "Forming Intentional Disciples: The Path of Knowing and Following Jesus", observed. She said many Catholics receive the sacraments externally without the inner transformation and conversion, "If our pastoral practice is to be life changing, then we must be acutely aware that the reception of a valid sacrament and the fruitful reception of sacramental grace are two different but related issues. Validity means that the sacrament was truly bestowed and the intended grace made truly present to the person receiving the sacrament. But validity does not guarantee that the grace made available has been actively received and is bearing fruit in that person's life."

In short, according to Weddell, an intentional disciple is one who has made a searching and deliberate act of the will to "drop the nets" as the apostles did. He or she has to make a conscious commitment to follow the Lord Jesus in the midst of his Church as an obedient disciple and to reorder one's life accordingly.

In Luke 8:13, Jesus tells us that if our disposition is like rocky ground, we may receive his Word with joy but we will fall away in times of trials and tribulations. Similarly, in today's gospel, Jesus challenged his disciples to "count the cost", so to speak, of being his disciple. To "count the cost" requires us to recognise and agree with some terms. We are urged not to be like the crowds in the gospels who loved Jesus' miracles, healing, and free food. They were more desirous of the material benefits that could be gained from him rather than know him more intimately and understand what he meant by wanting to give them "food that endures to eternal life" (Jn 6.27).

Following Jesus therefore also demands that we let go of our own inclinations. This may mean losing relationships, dreams, material things - or even our lives. When we choose to follow Jesus

for the sake of only getting our own plans fulfilled, we can be quite sure that we will put him away when the going gets tough. We must allow Jesus' saving plan to govern our lives if we want to be counted among his disciples, "Anyone who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple" (Lk 14:33).

Intentional Discipleship also extends beyond being disciplined, making sacrifices and performing mortifications to embracing what our Holy Father calls "missionary discipleship". In Pope Francis' first encyclical, *Evangelii Gaudium*, (The Joy of the Gospel), our Holy Father said, "Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are 'disciples' and 'missionaries', but rather that we are always 'missionary disciples'...So what are we waiting for?"

It is commonly mistaken that being "missionary disciples" means giving up our careers and working in the slums. However, Opus Dei Founder, St Josemaría Escrivá, wrote in "In Love with the Church" - "Your daily encounter with Christ takes place where your fellow men, your yearnings, your work and your affections are. It is in the midst of the most material things of the earth that we must sanctify ourselves, serving God and all mankind... you must realise now, more clearly than ever that God is calling you to serve him in and from the ordinary, secular and civil activities of human life. He waits for us everyday, in the laboratory, in the operating theatre, in the army barracks, in the university chair, in the factory, in the workshop, in the fields, in the home and in all the immense panorama of work. Understand this well: there is something holy, something divine hidden in the most ordinary situations, and it is up to each one of you to discover it."



The Eucharist is the source and summit of the whole Christian life. The feast of Corpus Christi is a celebration of Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. Mainly celebrated by Roman Catholics, the feast occurs in either late May or early June, on the first Thursday after Trinity Sunday (60 days after Easter).

Corpus Christi

Similar to the tradition of the early church, the SFX community held a procession on 23rd June to give public witness to the community's faith and devotion towards the sacrament of the Eucharist.

The solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ and its Eucharistic procession give us, as Pope Francis notes, "the joy not only of celebrating" the glorious mystery of the Eucharist, "but also of praising him and singing in the streets of our city." They allow us to "express our gratitude for ... nourishing us with his love through the Sacrament of his Body and the Blood."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament can be administered to any Catholic awaiting serious surgery, suffering from serious illness or weakened by old age. Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest.
