A Child of God or Slave of Money?

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time 22 Sep 2019

Am 8:4-7 1 Tm 2:1-8 Lk 16:1-13

What was our reaction when hearing of the Steward's plan? Did we sympathise with his pragmatic utilitarian deeds or did we feel repulsed at his dishonesty? How many of us might have done the same if we were in his position? If we had knowledge that our job was under threat, wouldn't the natural "humanly" deed be to do whatever it takes to preserve it?

Indeed, while the desire for self-preservation is not wrong, it is important for us to consider the extent we will go to preserve ourselves. Perhaps we need our jobs as the sole bread winner of the family; perhaps we were wrongly accused. Would we then be justified to act "astutely" (Lk 16:8)? Can lying to keep our jobs be justified given that our family and others are depending on us; is it just to cheat since we have been treated unfairly?

If we are tempted to answer "Yes", then we would be guilty of proportionalism. A moral error, St John Paul II tells us that proportionalism occurs when one "focuses rather on the proportion acknowledged between the good and bad effects of that choice, with a view to the 'greater good' or 'lesser evil' [superficially] possible in a particular situation" (Veritatis Splendor 75). This

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
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relativistic way of reasoning directly contradicts Christ's instruction to "Keep the commandments" (Mt 19:17) which he states are necessary to "obtain eternal life" (Mt 19:18).

In view of this, it becomes clear why Christ elucidates the actions of the steward by saying that "the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light" (Lk 16:1-13). In doing so, Christ brands the steward as a worldly man, one who is competent in the ways of the world yet lacks the necessary disposition and morals to obtain eternal life. At this, we are reminded of Christ's maxim "For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life?" (Mk 8:36)

Returning to the parable, if we were not entirely repulsed by the steward's actions, how did we feel about the hypocritical actions of the master? Although he dismissed his steward for dishonesty, he later praises him precisely for being dishonest; deeming his steward's actions as astute instead of deceitful. If we were at first sympathetic to the actions of the steward, would this sympathy be extended to his master? If we saw our boss praise a colleague for dishonesty, would we not be repulsed by such a blatant lack of principles?

lt thus follows that Christ, the unscrupulous in exposing steward, simultaneously judges his sympathetic master as dishonest. For the master - himself worldlylacked sufficient virtue and strength of character to act on principle, but rather became impressed by the dishonesty of the steward and "praised his bribery" (cf. Pope Francis,

Dirty bread of corruption, 2013). Pope Francis also notes that such deeds are a serious sin because it contradicts our dignity, "that dignity by which we are united through our work" (*ibid*).

In concluding our reflection, special attention should be paid to the caution of Christ at the end of the Gospel narrative: "you cannot be the slave both of God and of money". Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI notes that "money" in the original text is "mammon" which is a "term of Phoenician origin that calls to mind... riches as the idol to which everything is sacrificed in order to attain one's own material success; hence, this economic success becomes a person's true god" (Homily at Velletri, 2007).

Considering all this, let us reflect once again on the dishonest master and his steward, asking ourselves if we truly sympathise with their "astuteness" (ie worldliness). Do we want to serve God virtuously as his children, or do we want to be enslaved by the falsegod of worldliness?

Rite of Christian Initiation for Youths (RCIY)



From 6 to 8 Sep, 23 RCIY (Rite of Christian Initiation for Youths) inquirers, who have been on this journey since the mid of this year, spent the weekend at the Church of the Transfiguration for their first RCIY retreat. The focus of this retreat was on allowing the inquirers to learn more about the different dimensions of their identity, and also to provide them the space and time to discover their true identity in Christ.

Each inquirer was given a special handcrafted journal which were designed by a group of talented youths from the parish. They then had the opportunity to use these journals as they were introduced to practice of journaling. In addition, they were also exposed to new prayer methods such as the Examen.

The sessions on Saturday revealed to them their 3 unchangeable fingerprints - that they are 1) Completely Accepted, 2) Extremely Valuable, and 3) Eternally Loved in the eyes of God. In the evening, they were invited to approach the cross in a para-liturgy, and surrendered an obstacle that was preventing them from taking a step closer to Jesus. They also went through the Rite of Acceptance, the first of all Rites in the RCIA/Y catechumenate journey.

Let us, as one church, continue to keep the RCIY catechumens and service team in prayer as we continue to journey towards the waters of baptism and confirmation.

"Going into the retreat, I was feeling weary and exhausted. I knew God loved me, but subconsciously I felt undeserving of His love for me. What really struck me was that He had already accepted me for who I was, for all my strengths and weaknesses, but was I able to allow myself to be fully accepted by Him?

I felt the Lord reaffirming me as His child, and giving that final push I needed to truly claim my identity as His child :) " "The camp was a great experience and it definitely managed to spark the faith in me after being skeptical for years. I will make sure it continues to grow even after the camp for what I had was special. I had prayed for God to show me what is faith and His love all about. Indeed, through this camp I realized He works in His own ways and time!"


