# **Humble Heart**, **Righteous Life**

30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 27 Oct 2019

Sir 35:12-14, 16-19 2 Tim 4:6-8, 16-18 Lk 18:9-14

How many of us are humble enough to voluntarily acknowledge and even publicly declare our faults? In an image-conscious world, we have meticulously constructed and seek to maintain a positive image. From the clothes we wear to the way we behave in public, we constantly manicure and construct an image we would like others to see; perfect and faultless. Ostensibly, this is a form of righteousness albeit in a fake and disingenuous sense.

Because we feel the constant need to "put our best foot forward", we may be tempted to overlook, even hide our failures to emphasise the merits of our achievements. Conditioned to hide our inadequacies behind seemingly perfect porcelain masks and gloss over our shortcomings, we find it difficult to openly acknowledge our faults and shortcomings let alone speak of them. Do we corporatise our filial relationship with God; pridefully listing our accomplishments in prayer whilst neglecting to humbly lift our hearts to seek God's help and mercy? (Pope Francis, General Audience 1 June 2016)

This has serious implications for our discipleship journey, for the inability to humbly acknowledge our shortcomings will inevitably make it more difficult to deepen

our relationship with the Father;

our pridefulness (ie righteousness)

closing us off from the mercy of the

God. Recalling the parable of the

prodigal son, we see that the son

was only able to reconcile with the

father after he "came to himself"

and acknowledged his sinfulness

Though God's mercy is infinite,

experiencing it hinges on our ability

to consciously acknowledge our

need for it, for the gift of free will

means that God will not force us to

deepen our relationship with him if

we ourselves are unwilling to do so

(Council of Trent: DS 1525). Behaving

like the Pharisee, therefore, will

close our hearts to him, for a prideful

individual will ostensibly lack the

humility necessary to seek the

mercy of God (Libertatis conscientia:

That said, being proud of our

successes is not in itself a sin and

just as a child openly converses

with his father, we should not be

afraid rejoice and tell God of the

accomplishments we have attained

with his help (St Josemaria, Friends

of God: 150). The Pharisees' desire

to live a righteous life was indeed

praiseworthy and should not be

prejudiced. However, the way in

which he righteously bragged about

his achievements in prayer, even

judging the tax collector, diminished

the quality of his prayer (St Teresa of

Righteousness in this regard thus

takes on a second, more virtuous

meaning. While righteousness in

prayer bespeaks of pridefulness,

it behoves us as baptised and

anointed children of God to live a

righteous life (CCC: 1028, 1042, 2569);

6282 3151, FrBrian@sfxchurch.sg remembering that living a righteous (ie virtuous) life is a most necessary duty (CCC: 2087, 2105, 2472). Putting our best foot forward, therefore, is essential, but should not eclipse the

need to remain humble in prayer.

Christ himself reminds us of this reality when he tells us: "when you have done everything you were told to do, you should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty'" (Lk 17: 10). Living a righteous life therefore is necessary, but we should live righteously in *humility*; remembering that we need to grace and mercy of God to live righteously (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, General Audience 30 Aug 2016).

Fittingly the liturgy at each mass puts us in the same position as the tax collector. As we echo the words of the centurion before communion: "domine non sum dignus" (Lord I am not worthy), we are reminded to approach the Lord in humility just like the tax collector. In striving to live a righteous life let us "always humble ourselves lovingly before God and before men, because God speaks only to those who are truly humble and He enriches them with His gifts". (St Padre Pio)
