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The End Times

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 17 Nov 2019

Mal 3:19-20 2 Th 3:7-12 Lk 21:5-19

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings describe the end times in sombre detail. Our First Reading speaks about the day that is coming that will "burn [the evildoers] up"; the Gospel warns us not to be deceived as "many will come using [Jesus'] name" and there will be "wars and revolutions".

CS Lewis' *The Last Battle* illustrates an allegory of these end times. In the story, an ape persuades a simpleminded donkey to dress in a lion's skin and pretend to be the Great Lion Aslan (a metaphor of Jesus). Using the donkey as his pawn, the ape deceives many into serving a false god and to contribute to "Aslan's treasury", on the pretext that it will be used for the good of all the people.

How do we respond to and prepare for such dire prophecies?

Scripture uses three tenses in talking about salvation. First, we are *already* saved. St Paul writes that "in hope we were saved" (Rom 8:24) and "by grace [we] have been saved" (Eph 2:5).

We are saved because Christ died for our sins. In the words of CCC 613, Christ's death "accomplishes the definitive redemption of men". By the sacrament of Baptism, all our sins are forgiven and we are born again in the Holy Spirit.

Second, we are being saved (see

1 Cor 1:18, 2 Cor 2:15). CCC 2010 makes it clear that no one can merit the initial grace of forgiveness and justification. However, we can subsequently "merit for ourselves and for others the graces needed for our sanctification, for the increase of grace and charity, and for the attainment of eternal life." St Paul thus exhorts us to "work out [our] own salvation... for it is God who is at work in [us]" (Ph 2:12).

Third, we will be saved. St Paul assures us that "now that we have been justified by [Christ's] blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God" and "having been reconciled to God through the death of his Son... will we be saved by his life" (Rom 5:9-10).

St Augustine wrote that "heaven and earth will pass away but the salvation and justification of the elect... will not pass away" (CCC 1994). CCC 1030 puts this another way: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

In the end, it is Jesus who saves. His life, death, and resurrection occurred 2000 years ago, but is continually re-presented at every Holy Mass, and we will be glorified in him in the last days.

Our Second Reading is then instructive on how we should approach the end times. Following his first letter warning them that the Last Day would come "like a thief in the night" (1 Th 5:2), St Paul's second letter chides all who had stopped working and were simply waiting around. Instead, he exhorts them to "go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat." (2 Th 3:12)

Similarly, we will not get any closer to holiness by simply waiting around. We should continue to carry out our daily duties and earn our daily bread, and in so doing, wait in confidence for the last days when we shall see the face of the Lord.

CCC 1040 sums up what this moment will be like: "The Last Judgment will come when Christ returns in glory. Only the Father...determines the moment of its coming. Then through his Son Jesus Christ he will pronounce the final word on all history. We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end. The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death."


