The Light of the World is the Light of Christ

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time 9 Feb 2020

Is 58:7-10 1 Cor 2:1-5 Mt 5:13-16

In the film *Coach Carter* (2005), there is a poignant scene when the most disrespectful basketball player in the team states what their deepest fear is. Adapting an extract from Marianne Williamson's *A Return to Love: Reflections on the Principles of A Course in Miracles*, the athlete tells his coach:

"Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness that most frightens us. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine, as children do. It's not just in some of us; it's in everyone. And as we let our own light shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others."

2,000 years ago, Jesus told his disciples something similar. "You are the light of the world" he says in this Sunday's gospel. "No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lampstand where it shines for everyone in the house."

These words are so empowering because they reframe the way we see our fears and inadequacies. If we fear

our light more than our darkness, it presupposes that there is light within us in the first place. It suggests that our light is stronger than our darkness.

But what is this light?

New age philosophies and films like *Coach Carter* suggest that this light resides inherently within us, and if we allow it to, it will empower us to be popular and successful in the world. These narratives suggest that the solution to our darkness is self-knowledge, self-help, self-empowerment. It is a light of the self, and if we allow it to shine, our selves will be glorified.

This stands in stark contrast to our first reading. "Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor; clothe the man you see to be naked and do not turn from your own kind," says Isaiah. "Then will your light shine like the dawn." (Is 58:8)

Our light—the light of the world—is

then the light of charity, of kindness, of compassion. It is the light of Christ. If there is light within us at all, it is because Christ resides in us and he is our light and our salvation.

This is the story of Christianity. We are saved, we are powerful, we are glorious—but not by our own doing. Only by grace. Only through Christ's death and resurrection. As CCC 460 puts it, "For the Son of God became man so that we might become God" or "...be united to God" as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI says (General Audience, 20 Jun, 2007).

In this regard, it is the line from Williamson's quote that *Coach Carter* omitted that holds the deepest truth: "We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us."

And properly understood, the glory of God looks a lot more like feeding the hungry and sheltering the homeless, and a lot less like winning basketball games.


SOLEMN MASS OF THE DEDICATION OF THE CATHEDRAL OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD



General Precautionary Measures



Observe good personal hygiene.

Practise frequent hand-washing with soap



(e.g. before handling food or eating, after using the toilet or when your hands are soiled by respiratory secretions after coughing or sneezing).



Wear a surgical mask if you have respiratory symptoms such as a cough, sneezing, shortness of breath or runny nose.



Cover your mouth with a tissue paper when coughing or sneezing, and dispose the soiled tissue paper in the rubbish bin immediately.



Seek **medical attention** promptly if you are feeling **unwell**.

Be socially responsible. Stay at home if you are sick.



Alcohol hand rubs are available for your use near the entrances of churches and confessionals.



Holy Communion is to be received by hand only till further notice.



No holy water in the fonts at the entrance of churches as this could be a vehicle for infection.



Comply with health advisories and control measures issued by the authorities.

Catechism Classes

To protect the interests of our children, all Catechism Classes (including parish and home catechism, CGS and RCIY) have been suspended until 1st March 2020. When Catechism classes resume, they should follow the prevailing guidelines from The Ministry of Education (MOE) which include these:



- · Catechists and students returning from mainland China are to go on 14 days' leave of absence (LOA), starting from the day after arrival in Singapore.
- Persons who have been put on a leave of absence should stay at home and minimise close contact with others. They should monitor their health closely and seek medical attention if they develop any fever or symptoms of acute respiratory illness such as cough or shortness of breath.
- Catechists and students should have their temperatures taken before classes commence.
- Catechists are to look out for anyone who has fever or respiratory symptoms e.g. cough, running nose. They are to put a surgical mask on such children/teens, sit them separately and call their parents to bring them to see a doctor.

Attending Mass For Persons Returning From Mainland China Please go on 14 days' leave of absence (LOA), starting from day 0 (day of arrival) up till and including day 14. You are to be excused from attending Mass or any other communal event during this period of time.

In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.

INFANT BAPTISM

Please check with the Parish Office for priest availability and Mass timing before confirming the timing at the crematorium. For prayers at the wake, please contact St.Pio prayer group via the Parish Office.

MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date. Church unavailable from 1 Nov 2018 due to renovations.
