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Being Merciful by Becoming Human

2nd Sunday of Easter
Divine Mercy Sunday
28 Apr 2019

Ac 5:12-16
Rev 1:9-11a,12-13,17-19
Jn 20:19-31

In today's Gospel, Jesus revealed himself to the disciples on the day of his resurrection, showing them that he had truly risen as he said he would. However, Thomas, also called Didymus ("twin"), was not there in the Upper Room and was adamant that he would only believe if he could see and touch the wounds of Jesus for himself (cf Jn 20:25).

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis says that we are like Thomas' "twin-brother or sister" in this regard. We, too, are incredulous about Jesus' resurrection and wish to see the risen Lord for ourselves. He says it is understandable for us to feel unfulfilled by "[a] God who is risen but remains distant...we too need to 'see God', to touch him with our hands and to know that he is risen, and risen for us." (Homily, Divine Mercy Sunday 2018)

Just as Thomas was willing to believe only if he could see and touch the wounds of Christ, our Holy Father directs us too, to see the depth of God's love and mercy through Jesus' wounds. Despite having been abandoned by his disciples, Jesus showed himself to them on the day of his resurrection with the gift of peace (cf Jn 20:19). Hence, "[t]hey understood that he had forgiven them". Pope Francis said Jesus showed

them his wounds not as a chastisement of their betrayal but the proof of his love, "To enter into Jesus' wounds is to contemplate the boundless love flowing from his heart...It is to realise that his heart beats for me, for you, for each one of us... Only thus can we go to the heart of the faith and, like the disciples, find peace and joy beyond all doubt." (*ibid*)

Providentially, we also celebrate today the Feast of the Divine Mercy as instructed by our Lord through St Faustina Kowalska. On 30 April 2000, Pope St John Paul II officially designated the Second Sunday of Easter as the Sunday of the Divine Mercy. He also canonised St Faustina Kowalska, the "Apostle of Divine Mercy".

On this day, we are invited not only to renew our awareness and gratitude for God's mercy but also desire to become merciful just as the Father is merciful (cf Lk 6:36). With so much injustices in today's secularised world, how can we find the strength to be the merciful and compassionate witnesses of Christ to the world? Perhaps we can do this only when we are aware of our own personal weaknesses, limitations, vulnerabilities and nakedness through the merciful eyes of Jesus.

As our Holy Father pointed out, "... we need to begin...to let ourselves be forgiven...I ask myself, and each one of you: do I allow myself to be forgiven? To experience [Jesus'] love, we need to begin there". It is only by welcoming this offer of Divine Mercy that we, having experienced the joy of being forgiven will be able to forgive those who have wronged us.

In pondering Jesus' glorious resurrection this Easter, we also come to realise that

our fallen human nature of sin and unforgiveness has been elevated by being made "partakers of the divine nature" through baptism (CCC 460). In his letter to the Corinthians, St Paul contrasted Adam and Christ. Adam brought a heritage of sin but Christ, "the second Adam", brought the gift of eternal life to all (cf 1 Cor 15:22). As such, Christ, by his Incarnation, Death and Resurrection has become the "perfect man" to which we must strive to model ourselves after: "For God's Word, through Whom all things were made, was Himself made flesh and dwelt on the earth of men. Thus He entered the world's history as a perfect man, taking that history up into Himself... He Himself revealed to us that 'God is love' and at the same time taught us that the new command of love was the basic law of human perfection and hence of the world's transformation." (*Gaudium et spes* 38)

Let us today learn to become like "the perfect man" who is Christ. In so doing, it will also be in our human nature to be merciful, to forgive and to love.


PARISH FORMATION PROGRAMME 2019: SPIRITUAL GROWTH & SPIRITUAL DIRECTION


ABBA: ABUNDANT AND BETTER LIFE ABROAD PROGRAMME BY ACMI AND CFC



MAUNDY THURSDAY


"The washing of feet is both a humbling experience and an honour. I am proud to be Catholic." - Marcus Wong
