Disciples Making Disciples

Pride: The Queen of Vices

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Sep 2019

Sir 3:17-20, 28-29 Hebr 12:18-19, 22-24 Lk 14:1, 7-14

This week's readings denounce the proud. The gospel states, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted." The first reading states, "There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him." (Lk 14:11, Sir 3:28)

In fact, the Christian tradition has long held special condemnation for the sin of pride. St Gregory the Great called pride the "queen of vices". In the *Summa Theologiae*, St Thomas Aquinas reasoned that "the first sin of the angel can be none other than pride."

In *Mere Christianity* — a more contemporary example — CS Lewis wrote, "Unchastity, anger, greed, drunkenness, and all that, are mere fleabites in comparison: it was through Pride that the devil became the devil:

Pride leads to every other vice: it is the complete anti-God state of mind."

Why is pride such an evil? What exactly is pride?

Aquinas defines a proud man as one who "aims higher than he is". Pride is thus seeing ourselves as above others, and taken to its extreme, as above God. Put another way, pride is essentially putting ourselves first, rather than God or our neighbour; of seeing the world with ourselves at the center, rather than God or our neighbour.

The ancient philosopher and Christian martyr Ancius Boethius thus said, "While all vices flee from God, pride alone withstands God."

Lewis put it another way: "In God you come up against something which is in every respect immeasurably superior to yourself. Unless you know God as that and, therefore, know yourself as nothing in comparison—you do not know God at all. As long as you are proud you cannot know God. A proud man is always looking down on things and people: and, of course, as long as you are looking down, you cannot see something that is above you."

In this sense, pride can be distinguished from vanity. A vain man may inordinately

desire praise and admiration, but he at least values other people enough to want them to look at him. A proud man—the kind afflicted with what Lewis calls the "real black, diabolical Pride" sees others as so beneath him that he does not care what they think.

A man who cares not for the gaze of others must thus be honest with his own intentions: it could be because he only looks up to God, or it could be because he looks down on everyone.

Pride's corresponding virtue is humility. If a proud man puts himself before his neighbour, a humble man will put his neighbour before himself. In fact, he will be so focussed on his neighbour that he forgets himself. A humble man is a selfless man.

Lewis thus concluded, "Do not imagine that if you meet a really humble man he will be what most people call 'humble' nowadays: he will not be a sort of greasy, smarmy person, who is always telling you that, of course, he is nobody. Probably all you will think about him is that he seemed a cheerful, intelligent chap who took a real interest in what you said to him... He will not be thinking about humility: he will not be thinking about himself at all."

1Cor12 Retreat

Amidst the bustle of an increasingly noisier world, 1Cor12 had a retreat with Jesus last weekend. The retreatants were displaced from their comfort zones through activities such as improvisational acting, giving care packages to the needy in Kovan and a pilgrimage in Punggol. They were challenged to experience God and listen to his voice through the discomfort. There was time and space for silence, to encounter God.



The retreat was organised by the Parish of St Ignatius' De Vita Christi (DVC). Comprising of five 'communistries' i.e. community-ministries, ranging from teenagers to young adults, DVC shares a special relationship with 1Cor12, as many of the members have shared journeys, are good friends, or are married to one another.

Christ said, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." How much more will heaven open when two or three communities, or two or three parishes, are gathered in his name! Thank you, DVC, for being the life of Christ to us! "Despite not being able to stay throughout the retreat, the weekend was filled with grace. I was awed by the sense of community and church even though I did not know every person from the 1Cor12 community; and some are from different age groups and stages of life. Yet coming together to share and pray for each other allowed me to connect with others with whom I otherwise would not have done. This is also the case for my 5 and 2 year olds.
