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Lost and Found! Rejoice and Serve!

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time 15 Sep 2019

Ex 32:7-11. 13-14 1 Tim 1:12-17 Lk 15:1-32

The Pharisees and scribes in today's gospel persisted in seeing the "tax collectors and sinners" as outcasts and beyond redemption – even though they had gathered around Jesus in the hope that he could change their lives (cf Lk 15:1-2).

In response to their hardheartedness, Jesus relates three parables on divine mercy - a shepherd who leaves behind ninety-nine sheep in the wilderness to seek out one lost sheep, a woman who sweeps out her whole house in search of a lost coin and a father who throws a magnificent feast when his prodigal or lost son finally returns home. In explaining the rich symbolism in the shepherd, the woman and the father, 4th century Church Father and Doctor of the Church, St Ambrose said, "Who are these three persons: the shepherd, the woman, the father? Is not Christ the Shepherd, the Church the woman, and God the Father? Christ Who took upon Himself your sins bears you upon His own Body; the Church searches for you; the Father receives you back... First, mercy, second, intercession, third, reconciliation...the Redeemer comes to our aid, the Church intercedes for us, the Creator restores us to Himself." (St Ambrose of Milan, Commentary on St Luke, ch.15)

As Church, we have been found by Christ our Good Shepherd and we must strive to remain in this safe place and conduct ourselves according to the new dignity we have been given, "We are His sheep; let us pray that He will place us amid the waters of His refreshment (Ps. 22:2)...let us seek of Him a place of pasture. We are pieces of silver; let us jealously cherish our value. We are children; let us hasten to our Father." (ibid)

Holy Mass, where we are fed with God's Word and the Eucharist, is our "place of pasture"; by God's adoption through the waters of baptism, we have become children of his kingdom and co-heirs with Christ (cf Rom 8:17).

Unless we persevere in being rooted in the mysteries of our faith, we can easily become lost again by leaving the way God has marked out for us and by fashioning a God on our own terms (cf Ex 32:8). The Pharisees and scribes fashioned a legalistic God and burdened the people with hundreds of religious obligations (cf Mt 23:4). In today's first reading, the Israelites made and worshipped a golden calf. This apostasy is very subtle as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explained in The Spirit of the Liturgy, "[the people were] completely attached to the same God...who led Israel out of Egypt... [but they] cannot cope with the

invisible, remote, and mysterious God... They want to bring him down into their own world, into what they can see and understand...[it is a] self-generated cult...a festival of self-affirmation" - it is devoid of any saving help.

The proper and perfect image of God's saving help can only be found in Christ and his cross. As St Paul firmly urged, "Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." (1 Tim 1:15) This mission of saving sinners has now been entrusted to us the church. At his Ascension, Christ instructed the church to go baptise all nations in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (cf Mt 28:19). We have the mission, as St Ambrose pointed out, to search out those who are lost and to intercede for their conversion and transformation.

In all three parables, Jesus tells us there is much rejoicing in heaven when a sinner who had been lost is found. Unlike the Pharisees and scribes, may we be filled with rejoicing when we see others try to transform their lives for Christ. May we also be zealous like St Paul to be called into Christ's service - becoming his messengers of reconciliation to those who are lost and waiting to be brought home to the Father's house.



Catholic Education Sunday: What is Our Role in Preserving Catholic Education?



The Archdiocese has designated 15 Sep 2019 as Catholic Education Sunday. The aim of Catholic Education Sunday (CES) is to underscore the importance of School-Church-Home partnerships in delivering a unique Catholic education where Christ is the centre of all we do. The theme of Catholic Education Sunday 2019 is "Many Gifts, One Mission".

There is a fear these days that Catholic schools are 'not Catholic enough'. But do not misinterpret this to mean that non-Catholic students should not be studying in Catholic schools. All are welcome to learn together with our Catholic children, to imbibe the values taught in our mission schools, and in the process, to evangelise and grow them in the Catholic faith.

But what is Catholic education in Catholic or mission schools and what does it mean by 'not Catholic enough'?

During a meeting with Catholic educators in August on issues relating to Catholic education, Archbishop William Goh explained that to be truly Catholic, our schools must be Catholic not just in identity but in their selfunderstanding. By this, he meant that Catholic education must be inspired by the Gospel, faith in God, and our dignity as God's children to share in the life of God eternally. He said that promoting human dignity is the first principle underpinning a Catholic education which contributes to an evangelising Church by announcing that we are children of God, our true identity and our heavenly calling. He added that students must be passionate in pursuing truth, goodness, love and beauty, and they must grow to be a beacon for others by serving God and humanity, and living a life that is purposeful, meaningful and fruitful.

What is alarming, as raised by Archbishop Goh, is that the growing secularisation in our society causes the absence of the Sacred in public life, the loss of contact with the presence of God which leads to a loss of faith and despair about the meaning of life and the future of humanity. He said that the consequence of this is that our young people are embracing the relativistic, individualistic and materialistic values of the world, taking their directions and values in life from social media and the internet rather than from the Gospel which speaks of integrity, truth, charity, selfless service and a clear hope for eternal life with God.

PRAYER FOR OUR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS COMPOSED BY HIS GRACE ARCHBISHOP WILIAM GOH


Heavenly Father, you formed us in your image and likeness, to give you glory. Bless our Catholic schools, that they may raise gracious men and women of integrity and compassion.
