## Pray & **Never Lose Heart**

29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 20 Oct 2019

Ex 17:8-13 2 Tim 3:14-4:2 Lk 18:1-8

Luke's gospel is sometimes called the Gospel of Prayer. More than in all the other three gospels combined, Luke often directs the readers' attention to Jesus being at prayer being in intimate communion with God the Father.

There are nine episodes of Jesus at prayer recorded by Luke. He is the only writer to tell us that Jesus was praying after his baptism when the heavens opened and the Father's voice confirmed him as "beloved Son" (Lk 3:21). Luke is also the only one to tell us that Jesus prayed from the cross for those who had sought his crucifixion, asking God to forgive them, "...for they know not what they do." (Lk 23:34) Today's gospel is also found only in Luke. Jesus is presented as teaching his disciples about prayer and the need to persevere – "pray continually and never lose heart", "cry to [God] day and night" (Lk 18:1; 7).

Through the parable of an "unjust judge" who eventually yields to the "pestering" of a widow for justice, Jesus tells his disciples to have strong faith that God hears the pravers of his chosen ones: "...will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night, even when he delays to help them?" (Lk 18:7)

As God's adopted sons and daughters through our baptism, we are called to hold this unstinting faith that our prayers are always heard. This faith and perseverance demands determined effort on our



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part as the devil will do all he can to turn us away from prayer. We may also have "erroneous notions of prayer" seeing it as "concentration to reach a mental void" or simply "ritual words and postures" (CCC 2726).


What then, is the "correct notion" of prayer? Today's rubric calls us to fix our gaze on the crucifix. Jesus has "opened his arms on the cross" for us so that we can be victorious over sin - just as Moses raised his arms in prayer for the Israelites and they were victorious over their enemies (cf Ex 17:11). Correct praver should lead us into deeper gratitude and love for Christ who, by his sacrifice on the cross, has opened the way to heaven for us.

Last Sunday, five new Saints were canonised and therefore recognised as being in heaven with Christ our Lord – the Anglican-to-Catholic convert St John Henry Newman; stigmatists St Mariam Thresia and St Marguerite Bays; St Dulce Lopes and St Guiseppina Vannini. Our Saints in heaven are our "cloud of witnesses." (Heb 12:1) They are witnesses of God's salvation through faith in Christ Jesus (cf 2 Tim 3:15). Now in heaven, these "masters of prayer" continue to intercede for us that we may one day be where they now are: "Their intercession is their most exalted service to God's plan." (CCC2683)

So let us today reflect on how we pray and whether our prayers draw us into Christ's life-giving sacrifice on the cross. In heartfelt gratitude for the channels of grace through the Sacraments, Mother Mary as Mediatrix and the communion of saints, St John Henry Newman composed this deeply Catholic Prayer for a Happy Death:

"Oh, my Lord and Saviour, support me in that hour in the strong arms of Your Sacraments, and by the fresh fragrance of Your consolations. Let the absolving words be said over me, and the holy oil sign and seal me, and Your own Body be my food, and Your Blood my sprinkling; and let my sweet Mother, Mary, breathe on me, and my Angel whisper peace to me, and my glorious Saints smile upon me; that in them all, and through them all, I may receive the gift of perseverance, and die, as I desire to live, in Your faith, in Your Church, in Your service, and in Your love. Amen."

May our Father who led St John Henry Newman to so deeply cherish and acknowledge the fruits of his Son's crucifixion also grant us strength to seek and persevere in the Truth.

# **L2s First Reconciliation**



We teach our children what's right and what's wrong. But what happens when they have done wrong? They say 'sorry' and all is well again? The lesson has been learnt and life goes on? Well, not really. Our faith has given us a powerful sacrament - the sacrament of reconciliation or confession - to make things right again. Many Catholics treasure this sacrament for the peace of mind and soul which it imparts to us. It is a peace that flows from a certainty, rather than an unsure hope, that our sins have been forgiven and that we are right with God.

Our L2 children received this wonderful treasure for the first time 2 weeks ago. Though many were nervous and uncertain of what to expect, the catechists had been preparing them for many months. The parables, the craft work and also the 'how to' explanations helped in many ways. But as 8 year olds, they will have years ahead to discover the joy and true treasure of a good confession and to hear these words,





"Your sins are forgiven." (Luke 5:20)

We share below Lucas and his son's view of that day.

"When we learnt that the first L2 sacrament of reconciliation would be held on 5th Oct, we were excited but at the same time a little apprehensive. This was because that day happened to be the actual day of Colwyn's birthday. So we didn't know how our boy will react to turning up in church for the whole morning of his birthday instead of having a celebration somewhere else. We had wondered if we should reschedule his reconciliation but we eventually decided to let God lead the way for us. If God had planned for Colwyn's reconciliation to be on his birthday, then who are we to refuse? For we were reminded that God knows the plans He has for Colwyn, a plan to prosper him and not to harm him. Eventually we were glad that we did put God's plans first before any birthday celebrations because we saw how happy Colwyn was when he received this sacrament. He even managed to cut a cake with all of his catechism friends after the sacrament and we were truly grateful for his eighth birthday to be a day when he got closer to God on a higher level."

## Office for Catechesis: *Bridging Programme for 2020*



The Office for Catechesis (OFC) Bridging Programme is a catechetical programme for children/youth aged 9 to 13 who fall into one of the following categories:

- a) Baptised children/youth who have never had formal catechesis and wish to start.
- b) Children/youth who have 'dropped out' and wish to rejoin.
- c) Unbaptised children/youth who wish to be baptised and will join catechesis thereafter.

It uses the baptismal catechumenate as the inspiration for catechesis (as directed by the General Directory for Catechesis #90-91) which allows for ongoing discernment, and will include sacramental preparation, namely Baptism, first Reconciliation and first Eucharist.

Parents are expected to meet with their child/youth's catechists at the end of every term to review their child/youth's faith journey. In addition, there will be parent formation sessions conducted every term, to allow parents to come together as a community to pray for their children/youth, as well as to experience for themselves, some aspects of the programme that the child/youth would experience. This would enable parents to further dialogue with their child/youth about their own faith experience.

The programme is modular and runs for four terms (corresponding to the same schedule of local school terms). It is currently conducted at 4 centres:

Church of The Risen Christ: 10am - 11.30am (Saturdays) Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour (OLPS): 10am - 11.30am (Saturdays)

**Blessed Sacrament Church**: 7.30pm - 9pm (Fridays) **Church of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary**: 7pm - 8.30pm (Thurdays)
