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away receives forgiveness and the joy of entering the Kingdom of Heaven. 'Truly...today you will be with me in Paradise'. With these words, lesus, from the throne of the Cross welcomes every human being with infinite mercy." (Angelus, 21 Nov 2010)

The figure of the innocent yet grievously suffering Christ had Thief" moved the "Good to repentance and recognition of Jesus as the Son of God. From the cross, Jesus also prayed that God would forgive the people's indifference, the religious leaders' envy and the soldiers' drunken cruelty – "for they do not know what they are doing" (Lk 23:34). St Paul tells us in today's second reading that Jesus "made peace by his death on the cross." (Col 1:20) In a sense, we are like the Good Thief each time we go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation - it is often in our foolishness or weakness that we commit sin but with our sincere repentance, absolution is always granted, we are healed by Christ and must endeavor to progress in the life of the Spirit (cf CCC 1458).

From his cross-throne, Christ also gave us the Eucharist to help us progress in this life of the Spirit. He prepared this at the Last Supper and poured himself out to give us eternal life in him as Pope Emeritus explains, "The Cross is already anticipated in [the Last Supper]. For when Christ gives his Body and his Blood ... this assumes that he is really giving up his life. In that sense, these words are the inner act of the Cross, which occurs when God transforms this external violence against him into an act of self-donation to mankind.



Priest in Residence:

"God turn[ed] murder into salvation" says the Catechism (CCC 312). Today, as we receive our Lord in Holy Communion, let us properly enthrone him - not "up there" and away from us but intimately close because he loves us. Let him be enthroned and reign in our minds, our wills, our hearts and our bodies (cf Quas Primas 33). As Christ was on the cross for us, let us be the same for others. St Paul says this is possible because we have "the strength based on his own glorious power, never to give in, but to bear anything joyfully...[because] in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins." (cf Lk 9:34; Col 1:11,14)

Where is Christ's **Throne?**

Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 24 Nov 2019

2 Sam 5:1-3 Col 1:12-20 Lk 23:35-43

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year as we celebrate the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, many of us may have an image of Christ enthroned "up there" in heaven – now "safe" from earth which gave him a horrendous "welcome" by crucifying him.

If this is our immediate image of today's Solemnity, the choice of today's gospel will puzzle us. The Liturgy gives us a gospel seemingly devoid of kingship and glory. Luke tells us that as Christ hung crucified people between two thieves, were simply "watching Jesus", the religious leaders "jeered at him", the soldiers "mocked him too" saying, "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." (Lk 23:35)

Where in this account is Christ's majestic throne and mighty power?

Christ's crucifixion, in fact, reveals most gloriously Christ's power and majesty according to Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI because Christ transformed the cross into his throne, "...on the Cross, Jesus is exalted to the very 'height' of the God who is Love...In fact, while the Lord... is between two wrong-doers, one of them, aware of his sins, opens himself to truth, arrives at faith and prays...'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom' ... the so-called 'Good Thief' straight

SFX FEAST DAY AUCTION



Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick



The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death. It is most likely one of the last sacraments one will receive. A sacrament is an outward sign established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace. In more basic terms, it is a rite that is performed to convey God's grace to the recipient, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Moments of mental or physical illness can be times of crisis. They can mean a time of loss and pain, a time of insight and growth, or anything in between (cf. CCC 1501). Regardless, our loving God wants to be a part of our experience. He wants to share our lives with us, the bad and the good (cf. CCC 1503). But his presence and support often comes in and through the Church—our faith community. The Church can officially support us through the sacraments. In the case of an illness, that support comes in the form of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (cf. CCC 1511).

Clearly recognizing that human frailty is a part of the reality of life, our loving God is with us through this sacrament to strengthen us when our minds or bodies grow weak. Thus, a person facing a significant surgery is encouraged to avail themselves of this sacrament (cf. CCC 1515), as well as the aged or seriously ill (cf. CCC 1513).

In what way is this a healing sacrament?

In the Anointing of the Sick, the focus is on the possibility of a spiritual and/or a physical healing. The prayers address the sick person as a whole, which includes all aspects of our human life. So while a physical or psychological ailment may be the most obvious cause of the person's suffering, other aspects of the person's health are also taken into consideration. Many times, the spiritual healing is far more dramatic than the physical. And sometimes this takes the form of an increased ability to accept the physical illness and its suffering.

What actually happens during this sacrament?

The sacrament consists of readings from the Scriptures, the laying on of hands, the blessing of the oil and the anointing on the forehead and hands, the communal recitation of the Lord's Prayer, and the dismissal. If the sick person is able to receive Communion, the Eucharist may be offered just after the Lord's Prayer.

It is ideal if the family of the sick person can gather for this ritual. If done in a hospital, the staff also may be invited to participate. The presence of others assures us that the Church is present in prayer. If such presence is not possible, the sacrament can be administered with just the sick person and the priest present.

Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest. In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.
