Advent: Our Pre-Christmas Gift

1st Sunday of Advent 1 Dec 2019

Is 2:1-5 Rom 13:11-14 Mt 24:37-44

All around the country, decorations are up and carols ring out in the malls. Pre-Christmas "Christmas" merrymaking has also started however in the midst of all this merriment, some of us may be feeling a muted sadness. Deep within ourselves, we know that getting together and enjoying each other no matter how wonderful that may be - is not what Christmas is about. When no one is speaking about Jesus Christ at these gatherings (afterall, it is CHRISTmas!), who or what, are we then celebrating?

As the liturgical colour is changed to purple today, we are reminded that the Church is also entering her own pre-Christmas celebration called Advent. There may be an absence of merrymaking but the Church is not short of reasons for great rejoicing in the Lord!

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin "adventus" which in Greek is "parousia" and has the meaning of "coming". In the ancient world, it was a technical term referring to the arrival of an official - especially that of a king to the provinces. In Advent, the Church, in fact, celebrates two comings of Christ our King (Advent Preface). Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI describes our frame of mind in this season as "a dual impulse of the spirit". This is because we are not only

looking ahead to the second coming of Christ, "the glorious return of the Lord Jesus" but also "remembering with emotion his birth in Bethlehem." (Angelus, 27 Nov 2005)

This four-week season of Advent is therefore both a celebration and a gift. It is a celebration because we can be "exultant in his praise" that Christ took on "the lowliness of human flesh" at his first coming 2000 years ago and by his crucifixion, resurrection and ascension, "opened for us the way to eternal salvation." (Advent Preface)

Advent is also a gift - a time to uncover new richness in the Christian life. As a penitential season, it invites us to a deeper awareness of our sinfulness, to seek reconciliation with God and experience more powerfully the Holy Spirit's help in battling sin - making us radiant "with righteous deeds" to meet Christ at his second coming (today's Collect). St Paul in today's second reading calls this gift of Christ's Spirit the "armour" of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Spirit empowers us to "live decently...[have] no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness...no wrangling or jealousy" - in other words, with the Spirit's help, we can grow in selfmastery or control the desires of the flesh and "live in accordance with the Spirit." (Rom 13:13-14; 8:3)

Perhaps the most famous testimony of being freed from this "madness of

lust" is St Augustine. Having fervently invoked the Holy Spirit's help to excise his "thorns of lust", he also learnt the importance of persistent prayer, "... the greater our desire, the larger will be our capacity to receive the gift, which is very great indeed...The more fervent the desire, the more worthy will be its fruits." (Confessions Book 2, Letter 130)

As we begin this blessed season of Advent, let us more fervently invoke and desire the Holy Spirit in our lives. God's promise to be close to man was already prophesied in the 8th century BC by the prophet Isaiah. At every Mass, we are like the nations streaming to God's Temple to learn his ways and walk in his paths (cf Is 2:2-3). By our attentive listening to the proclamation of the Word, partaking of the Sacraments and conforming our lives to Christ day by day, we are obeying Christ's exhortation to "stay awake" and "stand ready" for his return which will be "at an hour [we] do not expect." (Mt 24:42,44)

The Church is God's new Temple and everyone is welcome to this royal and spiritual family ruled by Christ the King! This is the true joy we must rediscover for ourselves this Advent so that we can share this gift from Christ with all we meet at the "Christmas" celebrations - for merrymaking falls far short of the great rejoicing Jesus intends for all men and women as we await the coming of CHRISTmas.

"It is touching to witness the sick seeking solace and consolation in our Lord. And that this mass was helped by teams of 'multigenerational' parishioners, including the CM/NCC/Elders Group ministries who were our arms and legs in reaching to past attendees, truly reflected the church being the body of Christ."

"It was so apt that Mass for the Sick fell on the feast of Christ the King. This helped to remind us of the 'pilgrim' nature of our life here on earth; that our many blessings bestowed upon us by our Lord and King (such as mobility) can often be taken for granted. And our loved ones too who we may also take for granted."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The sacrament can be administered to any Catholic awaiting serious surgery, suffering from serious illness or weakened by old age. Anointing may be given before admission for the anticipated medical procedure. Contact the Parish Office to request for a priest. In emergencies, priests of the church nearest to the hospital can be contacted.

INFANT BAPTISM

MARRIAGE

Contact the Parish Office 12 months before your intended date to book the church premises and ensure that your presiding priest is able to make that date. Church unavailable from 1 Nov 2018 due to renovations.
