Making Disciples**

**True Love,
True Magic**

Feast of the Most Holy Family
of Jesus, Mary and Joseph
29 Dec 2019

Sir 3:2-6, 12-14
Col 3:12-21
Mt 2:13-15, 19-23

With all the consumeristic fanfare associated with this season, it would have been easy to view this season merely in a superficial and hedonistic way. Eating to our hearts' content, "retail therapy" and partying simply for the sake of "having a good time".

But did all this bring lasting Peace, fulfilling Joy, and pure Love to us and our families? Was Christmas as "magical" as we hoped it would be or was it just another mundane yearly affair - ritualistic, "un-magical", perhaps even something to be endured.

If the litmus for a good Christmas is comfort, food and consumeristic delights, then the Holy Family ostensibly had a "terrible" Christmas compared to many of us. In that first Christmas, the Holy Family had no room to lay their weary heads after their travels, the Blessed Virgin even gave birth to Christ in a cold, dirty, and forgotten manger.

The seasonal pleasures associated with our modern celebration of Christmas was not only absent in that very first Christmas, but the birth of Jesus also put the Holy Family in grave danger, causing them to become enemies of the state and political refugees

(Mt 2:13-15). They now had to endure the disconcertion of being uprooted and flung into a foreign land in order to protect the Christ Child.

Despite this, we do not once hear a word of complaint from Mary nor Joseph, instead we see their utter trust and conformity to the will of God. For there to have been "magic", the Holy Family did not need good food, good company, nor consumerist delights for they already had the True Magic with them - Jesus who is the very personification, embodiment and incarnation of God, who is LOVE; the ultimate source of all Peace and Joy in creation (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, *Deus Caritas Est*).

The presence of God's incarnate Love is further strengthened by the love they each have for each other, love that no amount of money, food nor company can ever replace (Pope Francis, *Admirabile Signum*). We thus see why the Holy Family was determined to follow the will of God, even forgoing their own fears and sacrificing their own will to protect Jesus. In their Godfearing wisdom, Joseph and Mary knew they had the ultimate treasure dwelling in their midst and were prepared to risk everything to protect, preserve and indeed dwell in its presence (Ps 128: 1-5).

The Christmas "magic" we often think of, therefore, is very different from The Christmas Magic experienced and possessed by the Holy Family. Theirs was a Magic which brought Peace, theirs was a Magic which engendered Joy, theirs was a Magic which flowed from Love; possessing Love, dwelling in the presence of Love, sharing this Love with each other and preserving this Love (St John Paul II, *Familiaris Consortio*). This magic is not something fleeting, which comes only in December.

This Magic is Christ, Christ who is God Incarnate, the source of all Love and all things good. If we desire to experience this Magic then we must strive to have Christ dwell within us and our homes throughout the year; that we, like the Holy Family may experience, dwell with and bask in the presence of Christ throughout the year (Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange OP, *The Three Ages of the Interior Life*). As we begin a new year, let us thus resolve to make our hearts and indeed our homes true dwelling places of Christ, the foundation of all that is Magical, the source of all joy and peace and happiness, consummate delight and perfect bliss (St Thomas Aquinas).

SiGN Myanmar Mission Trip

Members of SiGN (Sowers in God's Name) recently visited Nazareth Bush School (NBS) in Myaungmya, Myanmar from 13 to 18 Dec. We took the children to Ngwe Saung Beach, a 90-minute drive away, with two buses ferrying over 70 children. We also shared on the genealogy of Christ and planned activities to help the children better understand the messages from Scripture – that all of us are part of God's family and despite our imperfections, he always loves us and keeps his promises. All the children and teachers put their thumbprint on a specially painted picture of a tree trunk. The completed drawing, a beautiful symbol of the NBS Family Tree, was presented at mass as an offering from the children.

"What struck me the most was how the children treasured everything we gave them, especially when we explained about how they were all part of God's plan. It's amazing to see their face light up when they understood our explanations."


