





St Francis Xavier Kindergarten:

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Recognising the Face of Christ through Prayer

Feast of the Presentation of the Lord 2 Feb 2020

Mal 3:1-4 Heb 2: 14-18 Lk 2:22-40

In today's Gospel, Simeon and Anna were two venerable elderly people who had dedicated their lives to prayer and fasting. When Mary and Joseph brought the infant Jesus to the temple, they could immediately recognise the infant as the Messiah - a gift borne out of their contemplative life. The Feast of the Presentation of Jesus in the temple is also an extension of the "Pro Orantibus Day" that is celebrated on the Feast of the Presentation of Mary on 21 November. Pro Orantibus Day is a day of prayer for cloistered Religious, "totally dedicated to God in prayer, silence and concealment." (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Holiness is Always in Season, p286) Forty days after Jesus was born, the Church also commemorates the World Day of Consecrated Life - a day to reflect on the gift of consecrated persons or Religious to the Church.

The Religious profess the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity and obedience "as a sign... to attract all the members of the Church to an effective and prompt fulfilment of the duties of their Christian vocation. The people of God have no lasting city here below, but look forward to one that is to come." (*Lumen Gentium* 44) The Religious therefore, lead the people of God to holiness so that they

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too can consecrate their lives to God according to their state of life.

Lumen Gentium elaborates on this mission in these words: "In the Church, everyone, whether belonging to the hierarchy or being cared for by it, is called to holiness, according to the saying of the Apostle, 'For this is the will of God, your sanctification'...in a very special way this [holiness] appears in the practice of the counsels, customarily, "evangelical." This practice of the counsels, under the impulsion of the Holy Spirit, undertaken by many Christians, either privately or in a Church-approved condition or state of life, gives and must give in the world an outstanding witness and example of the same holiness." (LG 39)

Before Pope St John Paul II entered the seminary, he met Jan Tyranowski who introduced him to Carmelite charism. Pope St John Paul II was so attracted to the charisms of the Carmelite spirituality that he desired to join the Carmelite Order. He studied the Masters of Carmelite spirituality, particularly that of St John of the Cross. His philosophical doctoral thesis, *Doctrina de fide apud S. Ioannem a Cruce* (The Doctrine of Faith in St John of the Cross) speaks volumes of his voluminous love for Carmelite spirituality.

Just like Simeon and Anna, Pope St

John Paul II had a deep prayer life such that he could recognise the face of Christ nearby. In order not to disrupt his schedule, the Pope's trip planners made sure he did not pass by too many chapels or he would stop repeatedly to pray. During his trip to Baltimore, the trip planner had the chapel door shut but to no avail, "When it was time to leave, he walked down the hall, which was lined with doors leading into various rooms, passed by the door of the chapel, and then suddenly stopped. He looked back at the door, then looked at Father Tucci [the trip planner], and without saying a word, wagged his finger at him and shook his head. Father White recalled: 'He's never been in this place before, never set eyes on the place, and there was nothing about the door that distinguished it in any way as a chapel. It was just one more door in a corridor of doors. But he turned right back around, opened that door up, and he went into the chapel and he prayed" (Saint John Paul the Great: His Five Loves, p138).

Prayer is a relationship with God. Just as husbands and wives who have been married for a long time are able to sense what each other is thinking without saying a word, similarly, in prayer, we can recognise God's desires and will for us as we deepen our prayer life.

There is always going to be something that goes wrong or does not go as planned, but we have the freedom to choose how we react to it, and we can choose to react by glorifying God with our attitude, and in turn, living our faith.

Try to simply smile at one or two strangers today, you will be blessed by how it makes you feel and you never know what kind of impact it can have on their day!

4. SHOW YOUR GRATITUDE

We all have things to be thankful for, but it can be easy to overlook them or take them for granted if we are not consciously recognising the blessings around us. Finding the time in your day to recognise and react positively to the things around you will open your eyes and the eyes of others to the kindness and blessings that God has provided for you.

Go one step further, write a note or two to let someone know how grateful you are for them. Your simple words of encouragement will build them up and may cause a ripple effect.


AUDIO: Jesus is...by Fr Mike Schmitz
