Living With The Holy Spirit

Pentecost Sunday 31 May 2020

Ac 2:1-11 1 Cor 12:3b-7, 12-13 Jn 20:19-23

Pentecost Sunday is the perfect time to reflect on how the Holy Spirit breathes life into us. The readings today bring us back to the historical context of this sacred day when Jesus Christ breathed the Holy Spirit into the Apostles; it also links the past to the present and helps us understand the Holy Spirit in the context of today's challenges.

First, that moment more than 2,000 years ago when Lord Jesus said to the Apostles: "Receive the Holy Spirit." (Jn 20:22).

To understand the effect this had on them we have to remember the state the disciples were in at the time. Their Lord had been tortured and killed by his own people and betrayed and denied by some of his disciples. They were on the run and in hiding terrified, defeated and without hope. When Jesus entered the locked room, they must have felt a mixture of fear and uncertainty, but also perhaps of relief and hope. Their Master had returned and the first words he uttered was meant to comfort and still their hearts: "Peace be with you." (Jn 20:21)

But there was still the question of how they should proceed and from where they could draw strength and courage. What could possibly raise them from the depth of despair to become victorious martyrs unafraid to die for their cause? There can be only one answer and it came from the breath of Lord Jesus. And as he

breathed the Holy Spirit into them, he sent them forth to their mission.

"As the Father sent me, so am I sending you. Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained." (Jn 20:21, 23)

With such a blessing and clear vision, is it any wonder they were able to achieve the impossible?

Today, we too are anointed with the Holy Spirit, at Baptism and whenever, through the grace of God, we call on the Spirit to guide and fortify us in our Christian mission. Our situation today is no different from the early disciples even if the challenges are of a different nature. We too face many obstacles and temptations that cause us to stumble and stray away from the path to salvation. The Covid-19 pandemic is one of these great challenges. Amid death and disease, economic deprivation and social isolation and unable to attend Mass and receive holy communion, where do we draw peace, comfort and strength from?

Just as in the case of the Apostles, there can be only one answer. The Holy Spirit is here for us - and hence we explicitly welcome this spiritual communion in televised Masses: "I love You above all things and I desire You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart..." The Spirit was God's special gift to the Apostles for their mission to build the Church and it is ours to continue the work. It is through the Holy Spirit that Lord Jesus lives in us.

Each of us has been granted personal talents for this mission and it starts with the most precious gift of all, which is our acceptance of Jesus as our saviour. As stated in the second reading: "No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit." (1 Cor 12:3) Every one of us has gifts bestowed on us such as that of knowledge, wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, piety and fear of God (cf Isa 11:1-2). No gift is smaller or greater than another for we are all members of the same body and infused by the same spirit (cf 1 Cor 12:12-13). When we are faced with a crisis we become more aware of our God-given abilities and recognise that it is not possible to overcome the challenge on our own.

Pentecost Sunday is a time to remind ourselves of this basic truth, to thank God for his wonderful gift and renew our faith in him.




