The Eucharist – The **Greatest Gift of God**

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of the Lord 14 Jun 2020


Deut 8:2-3, 14b-16a 1 Cor 10:16-17 In 6:51-58

The Theology - The Eucharist as a Gift not a Right

In today's world so embroiled with "rights" and "privileges" it could be easy to mistake the ability to attend mass as a "right" let alone the reception of the Eucharist during mass. Do we view communion as merely a "part of mass" and receive the Eucharist out of habit? Perhaps we may even believe it is our right to do so having taken time out of our Sunday to go to Church?

Having such interpretations of the Eucharist ultimately cheapens this great gift from God and today's solemnity is a good reminder of its significance. Understanding the Eucharist as the *Greatest Gift of God* thus requires us to comprehend God's supreme gift of Jesus as the ultimate sacrifice for humanity's salvation. Not only was Jesus - the only Son of God - gifted to humanity for our salvation, he, as the second person of the Trinity - all supreme and omnipotent - allowed himself to be incarnated into time and space, taking the form of his own creation to save us. Moreover, desiring to continue to dwell amongst us, Jesus instituted the Eucharist allowing himself to be confected under the humble species of bread and wine that generations may continue to receive him and indeed experience his *presence.* (Summa Theologiae III, Q 73)

In short, {I} God - himself the author of creation - deigned to be incarnate within his own creation to save it.



{II} Being independent of time and space, he willingly constrained himself within it for our benefit. {III} Desiring to remain with us, he lovingly becomes present in the transubstantiated bread and wine, something so materially insignificant yet infinitely precious in spiritual terms. This especially if we consider that just "one drop [of Jesus' blood] can set the entire world free from all its sins." (Adoro Te Devote)

The Practice - The Eucharist as the **Bread of Life**

Frequent reception of the Eucharist was not common practice until Pope St Pius X encouraged "frequent reception" (Sacra Tridentina) in 1905. Before then, the laity would only receive communion on special solemnities such as Easter (as the "Easter duty"). This was not because mass was sparse but because the theological understanding of the Eucharist was that it was a precious gift a privilege that should not be diluted through habituation or routine.

Indeed, it was common back then for individuals to go to extraordinary lengths to prepare their souls for communion, offering up months of penance and fasting in order to welcome Christ with "clean hands and pure hearts" (Ps 24:4). Pope St Pius X rightly noted that "Holy Communion is the shortest and safest way to Heaven." It is the essential bread of life - the "fountain of life and holiness" - which strengthens our souls on its earthly

pilgrimage (Pope St John Paul II, Redemptor hominis 7).

The Action - To Hunger & to Receive

To retain the significance of the Eucharist, we are required today to observe a one-hour Eucharistic fast from food or water and **be in the right** disposition to receive Christ - i.e. be detached from grave sin (Canon 916-919). If we truly hunger for Christ, it thus behoves us to receive Jesus worthily, cautious not to unworthily drink the cup of the Lord to our "own condemnation" (1 Cor 11:29; St Thomas Aquinas, Lauda Sion).

Today marks the 4th month since the closure of Churches in Singapore. For most of us it means that we have gone some 18 Sundays without being in Church, let alone physically receiving Christ in the Eucharist. Unfortunate as this "imposed" abstinence from the Eucharist may be, we could also liken this unique situation to an "enhanced Eucharistic fast"; something contiguous to those embarked on by our spiritual forefathers. It may thus be fortuitous to take this opportunity to grow in our appreciation for God's Greatest Gift, simultaneously preparing ourselves to once again receive Jesus physically in the Eucharist when Holy Communion returns - that we may live forever with Christ (Jn 6:58).

What we celebrate

Corpus Christi is a feast day with the sole purpose of focusing on the Holy Eucharist.

History

Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. She thought that the Eucharist deserved its own exclusive day of reverence and recognition. She worked more than 40 years for the cause until her death. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.

How we celebrate

Usually, there may be a procession of the Eucharist around your parish. After which the "Pange lingua" (down in adoration), the traditional eucharistic hymn composed by Saint Thomas Aquinas is sung. The same hymn is also sung on Maundy thursday during the procession of the Eucharist to the altar of repose.

As the hymn is sung the priest offers incense on behalf of the laity, as a sign of our reverence, devotion and belief that Christ is truly present in the Host - the smoke symbolic of our prayers being lifted up to heaven.

Finally the priest will conclude the celebration with the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, a blessing with the blessed sacrament. While imposing the blessing, the priest uses a scarf to prevent his hands from touching the Monstrance. He also ensures to hold up the Monstrance to cover his face. This is to show that it is Jesus himself who gives the blessing and not the priest.

Did you know?



Corpus Christi is a movable feast and falls between late May and mid-June.



Pope Clement V made Corpus Christi an obligatory feast for Roman Catholics in 1311 at the Council of Vienne.



Symbols associated with the feast of Corpus Christi include an image of consecrated bread and chalice to depict the Eucharist; an altar; and a ciborium — a cup with an arched cover.



The feast is also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.



Prayers for the feast are Short Novena for Corpus Christi; Anima Christi



The day is celebrated with pomp in Spain and Portugal, and Latin American nations. In Seville, Spain, the festival was reportedly known as 'the Thursday that shines greater than the sun.'



Several unique customs are associated with the feast of Corpus Christi, that originated during the Middle Ages. During the 17th century Baroque Period, several processions across Europe had colourful characters and themes from both legend and the Bible. However, by the end of the 18th century, these colourful displays declined in popularity and eventually led to their removal.




Grand celebrations of the feast of Corpus Christi is still observed with the Eucharist carried out of a church on a monstrance vessel used by Roman Catholics — and being protected from the sun by a canopy.
