Trusting God at Harvest Time

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time 19 Jul 2020

Wis 12:13, 16-19 Rom 8:26-27 Mt 13:24-43

This week's Gospel reading concerns an issue that troubles many Christians. It is about good and evil, of wrongdoing and suffering. If God is omniscient and all-powerful why does he allow evil to exist, and for so many to suffer its consequences? There have been many explanations of this problem though we may never know the complete answer because God's plans for us will always be something of a mystery. But there is more than a hint in today's reading when Jesus Christ used the parable of the weeds or darnel to answer the question.

The response of the workers to the darnel that were growing among the wheat was not unexpected. They wanted to pull them out immediately. But the sower stopped them saying: "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull out the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn." (Mt 13:29-30)

God is the sower and his approach to the problem is central to our faith. He could have destroyed evil from the outset. But if God solved all our problems for us, we would not be the people we are with free will. Our dignity as persons created in God's image lies in freely directing our sentient and spiritual lives to collaborate with God's grace and grow in virtue and perfection (cf CCC 1700). His way was borne out of pure love because he knew that it

was the only way for us to experience his love. It is only when we consciously choose to accept his love that we experience it in all its glorious wonder.

For those who stray from the path, he offered a way through his Son Jesus Christ, who, through his death and resurrection, gave us a chance at salvation.

The sower chose not to pull out the darnel for fear of uprooting the wheat in the process. In the same way God wants to offer repentance and salvation to all sinners right until "harvest time" biblical metaphor for God's judgement). Then, he will separate those who have lived for the Kingdom of Heaven from the others. The message of the parable is that we should entrust to God the final judgement on evildoers. What we have to do is practice patience and urge everyone to repent and welcome God's mercy.

This approach that God wants us to take is also conveyed in the first reading from the Book of Wisdom. God may be all-powerful but he is full of mercy and compassion.

"...disposing of such strength, you are mild in judgement, you govern us with great lenience...By acting thus you have taught a lesson to your people, how the virtuous man must be kindly to his fellow men." (Wis 12:18-19) We should reflect deeply on what it means when God displays such forbearance towards sinners and evil-doers. It also speaks about our own attitude towards others. While we have to speak up against injustices, it is not for us to condemn those who might act in an unjust or unkind way. Our action should be guided by love and compassion, even to those who might trespass against us. Hence, we too have a part to play. If we can stay away from committing evil, it is because God has sent us his Spirit to help us in our weakness as today's second reading reminds us (Rom 8:26). We are the small mustard seed nourished by the grace of the Holy Spirit to grow into a tall strong tree (cf Mt 13:32). We should therefore help others to also welcome God's Spirit and grow unceasingly in grace to be hope and encouragement to each other.

PARSONAGE

LEVEL 2

SFX Kindergarten is temporarily relocated to the second floor of the Parsonage.

PARISH CENTRE & GROTTO AREA (CLOSED)

The area will be closed for renovation till further notice.

BASEMENT CARPARK

Drivers are able to park at the basement carpark and access JPII Hall via the open staircase.

IOHN PAUL II HALL & DROPOFF LOCATION

Masses will be conducted at JPII Hall. If you are being dropped off, please inform the driver to go straight and drop you along the parallel parking lots near the church's back gate.

MAIN CHURCH & FRONT PORCH

It is currently closed for interior refurbishing and the extension of the Front Porch with a non-slip ramp for drop-off.

Before coming to Mass, ensure you have registered with **myCatholic.sg** and have a confirmed slot for Mass.

1 Admission

Registration at Parsonage will begin **30 minutes** before the start of Mass. Doors will be closed and locked when Mass commences. **Strictly no walk-ins allowed.**



2. Verification

Bring your photo ID (NRIC/ FIN/Ezlink/Driving licence/ Passport) that you registered for verification.



If there is a discrepancy you will not be allowed in.

3. Direction and Social Distancing

Follow the directional signage and maintain a one-metre distance from each another.



Wear your mask at all times.

Don't crowd or mingle anywhere in church before, during and after Mass. Please kindly cooperate with the volunteers.



Contact Tracing

All visitors are to login with SafeEntry and ensure Tracetogether is active.



- 4. Sanitise your hands and wait behind the yellow line.
- 5. Step into the yellow box and stand about 50cm away from temperature scanner.
- 6. Scan your photo ID under the ID barcode scanner.
- 7. Ensure the blue area is focused on the forehead and your temperature will be screened. You will not be permitted entry if your temperature is above 37.5deg C.
- 8. Wait for the printout before proceeding to your designated seat (One seat/person).
 Anti-microbial wet wipe will be given as you enter JPII Hall. Please refrain from shifting your chairs or exchanging seats. Also, avoid physical contact and interacting with other parishioners.
- 9. Face masks must be worn throughout the Mass and there will not be singing. Hands should be sanitised before receiving Holy Communion. Please follow the directions of the wardens.
- 10. Holy Communion continues to be strictly received on the hand with your mask on.
- 11. Move to green box to consume the host, replace your mask before returning to your seat.

Please kindly help to sanitise your chair with the anti-microbial wet wipe provided to you before you leave the Hall.

Toilets are available via the passage way on right of JPII Hall - note the blue queue lines for gents and red queues line for ladies.



Please promptly leave the premises once mass is over. Exit right to walk-out or if parked along side road. Exit left to underground carpark via staircase at corner of kindergarden.
