Through Prayer, Man Disposes – God

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Aug 2020

Is 55:1-3 Rom 8:35, 37-39 Mt 14:13-21

Sanctifies

Our gospel narrative today recounts the miracle of the five loaves and two fishes, a well-known event detailed by all four evangelists. Aside from the ostensible miracle of the multiplication which we are all familiar with, deeper reflection of today's gospel reveals valuable insights. While the miracle of the multiplication is often the prime focus of exegesis, the events preceding the multiplication are equally significant.

Notice that before performing this miracle, we find Jesus withdrawing to "a lonely place" having learnt of John the Baptist's execution. The cousin of Jesus who leapt in his mother's womb in the presence of his Saviour and who had spent his life preaching Christ's advent, John's demise would have been felt most severely by Jesus. Despite having the power and authority to avenge John, Jesus instead withdraws; not only to mourn but also to be in silent contemplation – to be intimate with God.

In this way, Jesus sets an example for us to respond to personal hardship. Contemporary wisdom would tell us to "not go gently into that good night" (Dylan Thomas) and even rage against adversity and hardship, but Jesus, by withdrawing to a lonely place reveals that silence and contemplation are essential elements of sanctity – for it is only through intimacy with God that we may be able to channel God's love to others despite our own adversities; to feed the multitude.

We thus see the reciprocal relationship between spiritual intimacy with God (i.e. prayer) and miracles, for we can never presume to "convert any nation until prayer had first obtained the grace of its conversion" because "God in His providence has ordained not to cure our ills or grant us grace without the intervention of prayer. He wishes us to help in saving each other by means of our prayer." (BI Francis Palau OCD) As Cardinal Sarah notes "The life of silence must precede an active life." (The Power of Silence)

Importantly, intimacy with God must bring forth good works in our lives, engendering a deep desire to be "bread broken for the life of the world (Sacramentum Caritatis 88). Jesus did not merely remain in this lonely place – removed from the world and upon the boat – but was moved to "step ashore" to administer to the crowd that sought him. Spiritually rejuvenated, Christ feeds others physically through the food he multiplied and spiritually through his presence among them.

Seen in this light, the boat becomes a metaphorical representation of heaven and intimacy with God, something achieved through prayer and silence. On the other hand, the shore symbolises the humanity, a place we must all return to sanctify. Notably, Christ coming ashore from the boat also alludes to the

mystery of the incarnation. God made himself present for our sake, taking flesh derived from us and conformed to us in all things save sin, that we may be exposed to his teaching with words and examples suitable for us (St Maximus the Confessor).

Setting the example of good works brought forth through faith, Jesus thus challenges us to "give them something to eat yourselves." Notice that he does not say "I will give them something to eat myself" but instead asks his disciples to be co-workers of his miracles; to be "Cooperators of the Truth" that "the world may be permeated by the spirit of Christ and it may more effectively fulfil its purpose in justice, charity and peace" (Lumen Gentium 36). Indeed, the miracle of the multiplication could not have taken place without the disciples first providing the five loaves and two fishes.

Jesus asks us to "bring" what little we have to him, that he may sanctify our efforts. How can we do so in spite of our own inadequacies and hardships? By following the example of Jesus who first desired to be intimate with God before working miracles; that through prayer we may dispose what little we have to God - for him to sanctify, multiply and feed the multitudes.


