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It's all about Faith

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time 9 Aug 2020

1 Kgs 19:9, 11-13 Rm 9:1-5 Mt 14:22-33

Last week, in the Gospel reading of the Feeding of the Five Thousand, Jesus fed the multitudes through the hands of his disciples. The five loaves and two fish were multiplied as the disciples distributed them to the crowds (Mt 14:19). Our Lord not only honoured the disciples by working this miracle through their hands, but also gave them a faith experience to remember so as not to become unbelieving when the event is past, or when difficulties cause doubt.

In this week's Gospel account, Jesus offered his disciples a glimpse of his divinity through a shared experience that will further strengthen their faith. This shared experience started with Jesus compelling the disciples to get into a boat to go to Bethsaida, on the other side of the lake (cf Mk 6:45). Wearied and probably fearful after battling heavy seas and a headwind

through the night, the disciples had the terrifying vision of a "ghost" walking on the lake. Only when they cried out in fear, did Jesus identify himself as the "I am" (See Ex 3:14 - Moses at the Burning Bush) to calm and reassure the disciples.

Oftentimes, with the Church and in our personal faith-journey, God allows trials of "heavy seas and headwinds" to come our way, in order to root our faith deeper into our being. Just like Job, with whom God allowed Satan to test by taking away all his worldly possessions and even his loved ones, so that Job's faith in; understanding of and desire for God can be increased and strengthened when God comes to his help in the "fourth watch" - a biblical symbol for the darkest and lowest moment. Thus Abraham was proven as a righteous man of faith, when upon God's request that he sacrifice his only-beloved son on Mount Moriah, Abraham did not withhold his obedience.


Through trials, the Lord teaches us to manfully bear our difficulties and not to seek the easy route but to have faith in him, that he can work a good out of everything for those who love him (Rom 8:28). The reassuring fact is that God never allows us to be tested beyond our ability to bear it (see 1 Cor 10:13). Even

the most severe of trials and tribulations are bearable when we turn in faith to God for help and for the escape route that he promises to provide (Mt 6:13). In the case of the disciples, in the boat on a stormy and wind-tossed sea, Jesus comes to them towards the end of the night to give them an experience and a glimpse of his divinity. With each trial that we go through, God strengthens our faith which justifies us and in turn causes us to be more receptive of greater sanctifying grace in our lives.

For those who have the most ardent faith, just like Peter on the boat, a transformational experience of Jesus awaits in the midst of trials. Peter did not pray to walk on water, as if to show off. He asked the Lord to "bid me to come unto thee", out of a love and desire to be close to Jesus. To Peter alone, then, Jesus gave faith enough to come to him even if it means walking on water. Peter alone, acting on the Lord's call, had the profound experience of doing something supernatural by the power of his faith in Jesus. But whilst Peter's faith burned in his heart, his human frailty drew him into the lake when he felt the force of the wind. When that happened, even though Peter the fisherman must have been good at swimming, he cried out to the Lord who immediately stretched out his hand to sustain Peter.

What then is the state of our own faith?

"Dost thou love God? Thou walkest on the sea; the fear of this world is under thy feet. Dost thou love the world? It swallows thee up. But when thy heart is tossed with desire, then that thou mayest overcome thy lust, call upon the divine person of Christ" (St Augustine Sermon 76)

Celebrating the Solemnity of the Assumption with kids

On 15 Aug, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This belief, that Mother Mary's body (as well as her soul) was "assumed" into heaven, was defined as a dogma (core belief of the faith) by Pope Pius XII on 1 Nov 1950 in the Apostolic Constitution Munificentissimus Deus. But belief in the Assumption of Mary dates back to the earliest centuries of the Church.

What does this feast mean for us today? It affirms the Church's belief in a bodily resurrection. In our secular world today, we take for granted the concept of heaven and view it as an abstract, non-material, spiritual existence. But the Church believes that we will one day experience communion with God and one another in a material, bodily way. The Assumption also helps to remind us of the dignity of our earthly bodies. The message that our bodies are essentially good and meant for good is an important message and bears reminding to all around us.

How do we explain this feast to our children and how can we help celebrate this occasion with them?

AN EXPLANATION FOR KIDS

"On the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (to use the fancy name for this day), we remember when Mary was taken ("assumed") into heaven, body and soul, after she died. You will not find this story in the Bible. However, a tradition handed down from the earliest days of the Church says that Mary died in Jerusalem and was buried in a tomb. But when the apostles opened the tomb again, her body was gone. Why would God take Mary's body and soul into heaven? In part because Mary is special to God: she said "yes" to becoming the mother of Jesus. But God also wanted to show us that one day, all of us will share in the bodily resurrection of Jesus. Mary is the first person in the Church to experience the resurrection in its fullness."
