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
Hope in Suffering

22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 30 Aug 2020

Jer 20:7-9 Rom 12:1-2 Mt 16:21-27

In today's first reading, Prophet Jeremiah found himself as "an object of laughter" and mocked by the people of Judah. No one wanted to hear the message God had entrusted to him warning that the "violence and outrage" from the impending Babylonian invasion was part of God's plan for Judah to reflect on their idolatrous ways. So, the "word of the Lord has brought [him] derision and reproach all day." Jeremiah wanted to reject his prophetic call. Yet, he suffered even more, as he described, "like fire burning in [his] heart, imprisoned in [his] bones", as he tried to withhold himself from speaking the truth from God. Similarly, in today's Gospel, Jesus challenged his disciples that if we desire to follow him, we would have to deny ourselves, pick up our cross and follow him.

Our daily crosses come in many forms, shapes and sizes. Some crosses may be relational where colleagues, fellow parishioners, relatives or family members cause us pain - perhaps they also reveal a weakness on our part of not being able to fully love and embrace others. Some crosses may be physical where we may be suffering from some medical conditions - a recent diagnosis of cancer or an infectious disease, muscular disorder, physical disabilities, just to name a few. Some of us may even be carrying a cross of heavy responsibilities in a specific role - just like the Prophet Ieremiah, who suffered much as he proclaimed God's Name. However, not all crosses are part of God's



perfect will. Therein lies the question of whether we have been carrying a cross that does not even belong to us. Just like Prophet Jeremiah, God called him to be a prophet but out of his immense fear of suffering, he withheld himself from speaking, of which he suffered even greater.

By human reasoning, it does not make any logical sense to suffer. However, in John 12:24, we learn that "unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Essentially what the Lord is teaching through this is that suffering and death are part of every human life, and it is only through suffering and death that we obtain the glory of resurrection. Through faith, suffering brings about hope in God and through endurance, salvation. St Ignatius of Loyola said, "If God causes you to suffer much, it is a sign that He has great designs for you, and that He certainly intends to make you a saint." But let us be assured, as Jesus has promised, that when we come to him with our burdens and weariness, he will give us rest, "for his yoke is easy and his burden light." (cf Mt 11:25-30)

Catholic Spirituality speaks of a "dark night of the soul" - a spiritual crisis

in the journey toward union with God. Great Carmelite saints like St Therese of Lisieux, St Teresa of Avila and St John of the Cross all endured the pain of a "dark night of the soul", which lasted temporarily. St Teresa of Calcutta, whose feast day we celebrate on 4th September has been regarded by some writers to have experienced this "dark night" most extensively. According to her letters published in her book, "Mother Teresa: Come be My Light: the Private Writings of the Saint of Calcutta", she endured this suffering from 1948 - as she began her work in the slums of Calcutta - till her death in 1997, with only brief interludes of relief.

In today's second reading, St Paul encouraged the Christians in Rome to consider the rejection and sufferings they were facing as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for believers (cf Rom 8:18). Sufferings can cloud our perspective and we feel as if there is no hope, but paradoxically, when we rejoice in our sufferings, it produces endurance, character and hope (Rom 5:3-5). Let us always remember that the sufferings that we endure are meant to prepare for something greater, not just here and now, but also for the glory that has yet to be revealed.



- 2. Online booking will **close** by **12am** each day.
- 3. There will be no booking on Public Holidays and Sundays. The visiting period is from Mon to Sat: 10am 12 noon, 2pm 4pm.
- 4. **A maximum of 5 people are allowed per slot.** All visitors are required to wear a mask, SafeEntry for contact tracing and register at the Parish Office for temperature screening.


