The Meritocracy of God

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time 20 Sep 2020

Is 55:6-9 Phil1:20c-24, 27a Mt 20:1-16a

The gospel narrative today may unsettle us quite profoundly if we, like the early-labourers in the parable, employ a secular heuristic to judge equity, justice, and merit. In a society so permeated by the idea of hard work, equity, and merit, the seemingly unmerited wage of the late-coming labourers contradicts the very ideals we hold dear. Understandably, if we were in a similar position as the earlylabourers, many of us would have cried foul at the landowner's "unfair" wage practices - imagine working an entire day for the same wage another earns for working just a fraction of that amount!

The dissonance this parable engenders thus invites us to reflect more deeply on the *meritocracy of God* and challenges us to reevaluate our understanding of the economy of salvation. Does the landowner's action seem unfair because we hold an incorrect view of merit and fairness?

A common exegesis of this parable concerns *God's Love* for us and the impossibility of quantifying his *infinite love*. God, represented by the landowner, invites us, the "labourers", to be present in his vineyard – his Church. The wage thus represents the graces we in turn receive from being in God's vineyard. Privileged to see, experience, and indeed reap the benefits of God's love as his adopted children, we should not be envious when new "labourers" join our ranks. We should instead rejoice

when we see these neophytes reaping the same graces which flow from the infinite love of God.

Just as a loving mother would not quantify her love for her child base on his worldly success and merits, we as children of God should not enumerate nor compare the love of God for our fellow brethren. When we see others being baptised into the faith, do we scorn at their conversion or do we rejoice at their rebirth? Certainly, we should exult, for these individuals are no longer standing idle in the marketplace of the world seeking food that would see them grow hungry again. Instead, they, like us, now have the privilege of being in the vineyard of the God who is the author of salvation; he who has personally called each one of us to be close to him; to dwell in his abode, to work in his vineyard – The Church!

Moreover, the unwarranted jealousy of the early-labourers also calls to mind the jealousy and anger experienced by the elder brother in the parable of the prodigal son. In response the father had said, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours" (Lk 15:31), reminding him that he had always been fortunate for he had always been in the abode of his father while his younger brother was not as fortunate. Reflecting on this, we

should therefore ask ourselves if we expect, even subconsciously, some form of reward for our faith thus falling into the sins of jealousy and spiritual pride (*St Teresa of Avila, The Way of Perfection*).

If we think that our service to the Church as a member of a community/ ministry or even our attendance at mass merits some greater reward vis-à-vis non-Catholics and those less active in Church, then like the early labourers we have failed to see that our very presence in the vineyard, our labours for him and proximity to his true presence in the Eucharist are in themselves a reward beyond measure. This fact must therefore not lead us into ungratefulness nor taint our zeal for God; having been so fortunate to have been called out to be in his vineyard and to reap the fruits of it. These are the merits of God, the merits of his infinite love for us! Love without the expectation of reward is thus the currency in the economy of salvation, a "meritocracy" where love freely flows from the infinite heart of God (cf Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Angelus, 21 Sept 2008).

As the psalmist says: "For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness." (Ps 84:10)




HOW CAN WE PRAY FOR YOU?

ONLINE BOOKING OF COLUMBARIUM VISITS

All visitors to SFX columbarium are required to book a visitation timeslot online via https://tinyurl.com/ SFXColumbarium.





- Do make your online booking one day in advance.
- There will be no booking on Public Holidays and Sundays. The visiting period is from Mon to Sat: 10am - 12 noon, 2pm - 4pm.
- 4. A maximum of 5 people are allowed per slot. All visitors are required to wear a mask, check in with SafeEntry for contact tracing and register at the Parish Office for temperature screening.
- Each visit is for a duration of **20 minutes** (e.g. enter at 10am and exit by 10.20am, next available timeslot will be from 10.30am - 10.50am, etc. If visitors are late for their booked time, no additional time can be accorded).
- If the group is early, please wait either at the bench in front of JPII Hall or seats located outside the Parish Office. Please be mindful to keep a one-metre distance apart from other groups.

L10 Confirmation: Sealed by the Holy Spirit

Another 30 teens were confirmed, anointed with chrism oil and sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit on Sat 12 Sep. As Fr Ben prayed these words over them and asked the Holy Spirit to "give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and fortitude, the spirit of knowledge and piety; (and to) fill them with the spirit of the fear of the Lord", all were reminded that though there may be a variety of gifts, there is always the same Spirit, working in us for one purpose - to spread the good news to others.

In his homily, Fr Ben reminded the teens that this day was not a "graduation" or a time to "flee" from church. On the contrary, it marks the next stage of the journey. Together with the church community and using the bible as a "map", he urged all present to continue to pray and always place Jesus in the centre of their lives. God may speak to us in many ways and if we listen to him in our hearts, he will guide us through this journey of life.

Do continue to keep our youths in prayer as they sit for their exams and use the gifts of the Holy Spirit that have been poured onto them.
