# The Mind of Christ

26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 27 Sep 2020

Ez 18:25-28 Phil 2:1-11 Mt 21:28-32

Traditionally, part of the second reading today from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians is called the "hymn to Christ" or the "Christological hymn" because it reveals to us the way that Jesus thinks and the correct approach to Christian living. Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI notes that present in this portion of scripture, are the sentiments of "love, generosity, humility, obedience to God and also the gift of self." It invites us not only to merely imitate Christ as someone morally good, but to conform our entire way of thinking and living into how Christ thought and lived with "great love for humanity." (General Audience, 27 June 2012)

The hymn to Christ begins by affirming that Christ's "state was divine" or in other translations that "he was in the form of God" (RSV) – Christ was therefore a visible manifestation of

God's holiness, divinity and power. Yet, Jesus never viewed his divine dignity and equality with God as something to be used for selfish purposes. He did not "cling to his equality with God." (Phil 2:6) Contrast this to Adam (and by implication, all of us), who though created in the image and likeness of God, rejected God's grace, wanted to be God through his own effort and in so doing, lost the original holiness and dignity that was accorded to him.

On the other hand Jesus, though he is God, "emptied himself" and took the form of man. In doing this, Pope Emeritus says Christ entered "human reality marked by suffering, poverty and death, he assumed the likeness of men in all things save sin." Jesus did not even assume the condition of an average man, but assumed the condition of a slave which represents someone in the lowest strata of any society, who is dedicated entirely to serving others. Jesus humbled himself, immersing himself into our human condition, in a life of complete and total obedience to God, "even to accepting death" on our behalf for the original sin of Adam and all subsequent sins that we commit. And as if death itself was not enough, Jesus was made to suffer the greatest degree of humiliation by being nailed to a cross which is a cruel form of execution reserved only for slaves and not for free men.

Through the self-giving love of Jesus Christ on the Cross, the Adam who is in us is redeemed. Through Jesus' humanity and obedience, the original dignity in our own human nature, which was lost through Adam's disobedience, has been restored. Christ has opened up for us a path of grace, by which the Holy Spirit seeks to transform us into a perfect copy of his humbling (St Cyril of Alexandria, Festal Letter, 10, 4). Pope Emeritus says this happens when we, "in prayer, in the relationship with God...open our mind, our heart and our will to the action of the Holy Spirit."

One purpose of Christ's incarnation; suffering and humiliation, death and resurrection was to show us how God acts and therefore, how we ourselves ought to act. And St. Paul at the beginning of the second reading gave some practical examples of how we ought to act. According to St. Paul, joy would be complete if we are united in our convictions and love for one another, doing nothing in selfishness but in humility count others better than ourselves. We will find joy and fulfilment when we conform our human will to the will of God. Then, if like Christ, we allow humility, self-giving love and service to take the place of pride and selfishness, we will find ourselves with Christ in heaven.

In the end, "Man does not find himself by remaining closed in on himself, by affirming himself. Man finds himself by coming out of himself; only if we come out of ourselves do we find ourselves." (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI) To come out of ourselves, is to give of ourselves in love and humility in the service of others. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." (Mt 23:12)

- 1. This will be on a first-come, first-served basis. All visitors are to fill in their name, NRIC (last three digits and alphabet) and contact number.
- SCAN TO BOOK

- 2. Do make your online booking one day in advance.
- 3. There will be no booking on Public Holidays and Sundays. The visiting period is from Mon to Sat: 10am 12 noon, 2pm 4pm.
- 4. **A maximum of 5 people are allowed per slot.** All visitors are required to wear a mask, check in with SafeEntry for contact tracing and register at the Parish Office for temperature screening.
- 5. Each visit is for a duration of **20 minutes** (e.g. enter at 10am and exit by 10.20am, next available timeslot will be from 10.30am 10.50am, etc. If visitors are late for their booked time, no additional time can be accorded).
- 6. If the group is early, please wait either at the bench in front of JPII Hall or seats located outside the Parish Office. Please be mindful to keep a one-metre distance apart from other groups.

# First Holy Communion 2020



As Fr Casey Cole, a Franciscan Friar remarked in one of his Youtube videos, "Ah plans, how God laughs at them." Scripture also says in Prov 16:9, "We can make our plans but the Lord determines our steps."

Many of us can relate to these words especially in this pandemic time. Similarly for us in the Catechetical Ministry, we never expected to delay the First Holy Communion of our L3 children by a few weeks. We never planned to provide doctrinal input and prepare them spiritually through Zoom calls instead of face to face. We never thought of the need to celebrate four Masses instead of one, with the whole group spilt up, keeping the fellowship after Mass to little or none. We never imagined a fully masked congregation with individuals safely distanced and major parts of the Mass not sung but recited.

But as the saying goes, "when we leave everything in God's hands, we will see God's hands in everything." And so on Sat 19 Sep, God created a unique experience for 24 of our L3 children as they received the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time.
