Preparing for Eternity

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 8 Nov 2020

Wis 6:12-16 1 Th 4:13-18 Mt 25:1-13

As the year draws to a close, many of us may be well set in the mundanity of another year passing before us. Yet another year ending, another Christmas dawning upon us, another year of school, another in the office... and many more to come! Although we may have Christmas with friends and family to look forward to, perhaps the thought of having many more ahead and indeed another year before - brings a certain sense of "banality familiarity" to this well-trodden cycle – like the daily commute to work or school: dull, ordinary, routine.

Such feelings may be especially prevalent this year since many of us have been deprived of travel and leisure opportunities due to the ongoing pandemic. Naturally, these sentiments see us adopt a lackadaisical disposition in our secular and spiritual lives, a sort of "auto-pilot" mode in which we mechanically go through the motions actually being without present; not dissimilar to how many of us approach our commute to work or school: a necessary but brainless and loveless affair.

To such sentiments and dispositions, Christ in this antepenultimate Sunday of the liturgical year reminds us to "stay awake", warning us to not be as the foolish virgins who were unprepared to meet the Bridegroom (Mt 25:1-13). The lesson of the parable thus relates specifically to readiness; readiness for the final end all of us will arrive at: death.

As we approach the end of the year, Christ thus invites us to reflect on the times we have become "auto pilot" in our faith, perhaps even lackadaisical in nurturing the fire of our love for him. Have we treated Christ's invitation to be in his procession towards heaven as a thing devoid of sanctification and love?

Life is a sanctifying journey towards Christ with the destination being everlasting life (Lumen Gentium V) - it behoves us then to be prepared for the journey. This journey must not be banal, lackadaisical, brainless nor loveless but instead filled with eager anticipation, wise readiness, astute prudence, and burning love (Wis 6:12-16). Love for Christ who we so desire to meet and spend eternity with!

Just like the wise virgins ready with extra oil and astutely trimming their lamps at the Bridegroom's arrival, we also need to be eagerly expecting and always spiritually prepared to meet our maker; for we never know the day nor the hour when Christ will come knocking at the door (Mt 24:36).

In this regard, the current pandemic serves as a good reminder not only of the fragility of life, but also the temporal and passing nature of this world. Individuals young and old, healthy and frail, rich and poor alike have all fallen

victim to the virus. If a similar fate should befall us and lead us towards death's door, can we truly say that we are ready to meet Christ? Will we be ready to account for our lives? In this moment, will we be like the wise or foolish virgins – ready or unprepared?

In the same vein and having recently celebrated the Feast of All Souls, the phrase "Rest in Peace" used so often in the liturgy for the dead takes on deeper meaning. Life is a journey in the pursuit of sanctity (*Pope St John Paul II, Novo millennio ineunte 30*). Only at the end, if we have been prudent like the wise virgins in maintaining the fire of our faith will we be able to rest eternally with Christ (CCC 1821).

St Teresa of Ávila beautifully sums this up when she says: "Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly... Dream that the more you struggle, the more you prove the love that you bear your God, and the more you will rejoice one day with your Beloved, in a happiness and rapture that can never end." (Exclamaciones 15:3)

Let us therefore eagerly await Christ by keeping the fire of love burning bright within the lamps of our hearts, always prepared and ready to meet God - the very source and author of love itself.




