Talents - Use them or lose them

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 15 Nov 2020

Prov 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31 1 Th 5:1-6 Mt 25:14-30

Today's gospel parable is situated between the parable of the Ten Maidens (last Sunday's gospel) and the parable of the Final Judgement (the gospel for next Sunday). Together, these three parables give a clearer understanding of the final coming of God's Kingdom. The parable of the Ten Maidens told us that we will not know when the Kingdom will come, but we must be vigilant with our lamps (a metaphor for our lives), be filled with oil (a metaphor for the Holy Spirit) and give light to show others the way (a metaphor for good works inspired by the Holy Spirit). The gospel parable for the final Sunday of the liturgical year next week tells us how Jesus will carry out his judgement.

Today's parable of the Talents reminds us of the importance of having a correct image of God and how we are to use our God-given talents whilst waiting the arrival of the Kingdom.

The reaction of each of the three servants on receiving their talents reveals their perception of God. The first two servants immediately started trading with their talents. They seemed to know instinctively what their master required of them and went about it dutifully. In risking all, they generated a return on their talents, earning the praise of God. The third servant was afraid of God (Mt 25:25) and this fear stifled his ability to do anything with his one talent. He hid it so as not to lose it. Ironically, his "safe" approach earned a rebuke from his master.

The third servant said his master was a "hard man". He had an image of God as stern and harsh. This erroneous image paralysed him and turned him inward to protect himself, calculating that hiding the talent would enable him to avoid punishment. When we start from such a mistaken view of God, we stop growing as free persons but instead close in on ourselves in self-preservation. We also stifle the community spirit, thus curbing joy and impoverishing life itself. In contrast, the first two servants did not seek their own good, did not calculate, did not want things for themselves, did not close up in their own selves. Instead, they freely and naturally, without seeking their own merit, went about doing good and thus expanding and generating a return in their master's kingdom.

"On coming into the world, man is not equipped with everything he needs for developing his bodily and spiritual life. He needs others." In God's plan, "talents" are not distributed equally because he "wills that each receive what he needs from others. And those endowed with particular 'talents' share the benefits with those who need them. These differences encourage and often oblige persons to practice generosity, kindness, and sharing of goods; they foster the mutual enrichment of cultures." (CCC 1936-1937)

Each of us have been given "talents". In reality, the talents that God gives us are the "currency and goods of the kingdom" - a fraternal spirit in helping others, generosity in sharing what we have been given, and willing the good of others with self-giving love. The important point is not how much of a return we render from these talents, but how we use them in our daily lives to further expand the kingdom of God. Hence, the more we generously use



these talents to further the kingdom of God on earth, the more we will be given. Otherwise, what we have will be taken from us and given to those who can make better use of them (cf Mt 25:29). We can only do what is right with our talents if we start from the correct perspective of God as a loving Father who works tirelessly to gather his beloved creation into his embrace. God is not a stern, harsh master.

May God grant us the wisdom, understanding and fortitude to make use of his gifts to generously help others in their need. In the parable of the Final Judgement (next Sunday's gospel), we shall learn who amongst us God sees as those most in need.



Important Guide to Resumption of Mass in Main Church

Great news! Our Main Church is now ready to accommodate **100 persons** for Mass. Please note that these measures are in place so as to ensure the safety of everyone and to give every parishioner an equal opportunity to attend Mass. Do refer to the information below and let us do our part to keep our parish community safe.



THINGS TO NOTE:



Before coming to Mass, ensure you have registered with **myCatholic.sg** and have a confirmed slot for Mass.

Verification

Bring your photo ID for verification.



Admission

- Come early, at least 30 minutes before Mass.
- Families are encouraged to check in together in order to be seated together.
- Check in at the Main Church Foyer: for entry via Chartwell Drive and wheelchairbound parishioners.
- Check in at The Plaza: for entry via Cooling Close and drop-off passengers.
- All wheelchair-bound parishioners will be located at a designated zone, only 1 caregiver is allowed.
- Sanitise your hands before registration.



Wear your mask at all times.

Don't crowd or mingle anywhere in church before, during and after Mass. Please kindly cooperate with those on duty.

Receiving communion:

- Maintain a one-metre distance from each other and follow the wardens' directions.
 Holy Communion continues to be strictly received on the hand with your mask on.
- Do sanitise your hands. Keep your mask on and only remove it to consume the host when you are 2 metres away from the Communion Minister.

Offertory:

 There will be no collection during the offertory. Please drop your donations before or after mass at the entrances. Alternatively, you may donate via PayNow.

Inside Main Church:

- Please look out for the zones you are assigned to and the floor markings. No intermingling is allowed across different zones inside the church.
- Changing of assigned seats is strictly forbidden.
- Avoid use of mobile phones.

All visitors are to login with SafeEntry and ensure Tracetogether is active.

Exiting

 Please listen to the lector's instructions after Mass on how to exit and leave the premises promptly after Mass. Remember to check out using *TraceTogether* after leaving the premises.

Drop-off & Parking:

- For drop-off: Please inform the driver to drop you next to the Plaza.
- Strictly no parking allowed in front of Main Church. Drivers are to park along the side parallel lots or in the basement carpark and access JPII Hall via the open staircase.
- Please cooperate with the wardens.
