# What makes Advent joyful

*Gaudete* Sunday Third Sunday of Advent 13 Dec 2020

Is 61: 1-2a, 10-11 1 Th 5:16-24 Jn 1:6-8, 19-28

We are midway in our Advent journey to commemorate the coming of our Messiah, Jesus Christ, into this world. On this Third Sunday of Advent, how should we prepare ourselves for the rest of the period leading to Christmas?

One hint is that today is also known as Gaudete Sunday which is Latin for "rejoice". The readings today explain why this is such an apt description of what we need to do.

In the first reading, Isaiah reveals how he is filled with joy proclaiming God's words and doing his work. The tasks before him were not easy, let alone to be done joyfully.

"He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison." (ls 61:1)

How is it possible to exult with joy when trying to relieve the suffering of the poor, the broken-hearted and those in captivity? Isaiah tells us it is possible only if we believe we are anointed by God to undertake these tasks and that God's favour will be with us when we do so.

Looking at it in this way, how can we not feel immense joy knowing God is behind us and that his love for us is complete and unconditional? How can we doubt that they can be accomplished when our Creator who has dominion over the entire



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universe has chosen us specially to do his work? How can we not have faith when Christ died for us on the cross so that we may have eternal salvation?

In fact, Isaiah's words were fulfilled by Jesus, as recounted in the Gospel of Luke. When our Lord was in Nazareth at a synagogue, he was handed a scroll containing this particular passage from Isaiah. He read it, and proclaimed: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." (Lk: 4:21)

The second reading tells us the practical steps to take in this joyful approach.

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Th 5:16-18)

Pray and give thanks for all the blessings you have received, even for the smallest things and what we take for granted.

Praying and giving thanks at the beginning of a new day and the end of the day will enable us to feel the joy that comes from being close to God.

In the Gospel reading we are told the story of John the Baptist who preceded Christ and saw his mission as being a true witness to the Lord, to prepare the way for his coming.

Like John, we too are called to bear witness to Christ's coming. Like John, we too will experience ups and downs in our faith journey. But our load will be lightened if we truly believe that God has anointed us for the task, in the sense described in the first and second reading.

When we do so, we will feel the joy that comes from knowing we are fulfilling God's will.

So, as our Advent journey proceeds towards Christmas. we should continue to reflect on what is it that we are waiting for.



If we are truly waiting for the Lord's return and asking ourselves how we should prepare for it, today's readings give us the perfect answer. Rejoice in the Lord and bear witness to his coming with joy and exultation.

This joy does not come from material goods or the satisfaction of our desires. It is a joy from God's love that is so overwhelming it can only be described with the sort of powerful imagery that Isaiah used in the first reading:

"...for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels." (Is 61:10-11)

What better way to wait for the Lord's return than to be full of this joy.

"Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our LORD; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the LORD is your strength." (Neh 8:10)

Very often, we tend to feel that being joyful and being happy are the same. In fact there are some similarities but they can be vastly different.

I remember that I was very happy when I laid my hands on a brand new iPhone X some years ago. I was intrigued by the construction and the many more capabilities it had as compared to my previous phone. Needless to say, I spent much time toying with this new device but this happiness was barely there after a few weeks. It was just another phone that served the same purpose as my previous ones.

On a different note, I still remember the significant event in my life four years ago. Some people wondered why I did not seem at all excited at all about my upcoming sacerdotal ordination, but was strangely stoic. What I was feeling inside of me was the awareness of the vocation choice that I was going to make, how unworthy I was to be chosen by the Lord to live and minister as his priest, and the challenges and difficulties of the pastoral ministry.

In spite of all these feelings, there was an inexplicable peace and joy to know that Jesus would always be with me. These words of our Lord came to me, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." (Jn 15:9;11)

I realised that as long I remain in the love of God, peace and joy will surely be there. Sts Peter and Paul were suffering while spreading the good news of the love of Jesus but I am very sure that they were at peace, and were even joyful during their difficult moments.

It is not difficult to find joy in good times. To find joy, deeply seated in our hearts in times of trial and tribulations, will take some faith in our Lord Jesus, who came to us in the form of a helpless baby.

He wants to share in our happiness, and even more so, he wants to be with us in our most difficult times. Is 53:4-5 reminds us, "Ours were the sufferings he bore, ours the sorrows he carried.... On him lies a punishment that brings us peace, and through his wounds we are healed."

This is the God who loves us. This is Jesus who loves us. He continues to reassure us, "Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, so that your joy may be complete." (Jn 16:24)

This Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent, commonly called Gaudete Sunday or the Sunday of Joy. The vestments of the priests change from a sombre violet/ purple to a lighter colour of rose/pink. We are mid-way through Advent.

In all things, let us continue to find faith in Jesus. Know that in him, we can find the joy and peace that only he can bring. Keep smiling because the joy of the Lord is our strength.
