The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph 27 Dec 2020

Gen 15:1-6, 21:1-3 Heb 11:8, 11-12, 17-19 Lk 2:22-40

While today's feast is widely known as the feast of the Holy Family, its proper title is the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Church has named each member of the Holy Family in today's feast in order to pay special attention to each of its members. The Holy Family, therefore, is not just Jesus' Family or Mary's. Nor is it simply a functionary institution through which Jesus was raised. Instead as the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, the Holy Family brought to perfection the Divine Will of God, through the individual sanctity of its members; forming the nucleus in which God Incarnate was raised, protected and nurtured.

Indeed, the role St Joseph as Christ's earthly father and his patriarchal role as protector and guide has often been overlooked. It is thus fitting that Pope Francis, considering the grave times we currently live in, has decided to proclaim the Year of St Joseph, invoking him as Patron of the Universal Church to guard the faithful and preserve our especially in this time of need (Patris Corde). While St Joseph is often known as the legal father of Jesus, not many appreciate him as Patron of the Universal Church (Blessed Pius IX, Quemadmodum Deus). Being members of the Universal

Church, we can therefore look to St Joseph as our protector and personal patron.

It may seem odd that St Joseph, whose words are not recorded in the gospel, nor whose deeds are mentioned anywhere else besides the infancy narratives, should have such a pronounced devotion in our faith. On closer examination, we see that the honour due to him is not unfounded, for *God himself, chose Joseph to be his earthly father*. God found St Joseph to be a "just man" (Mt 1:19) who was not only responsive to divine will but obedient in its administration, despite any personal hardships which came his way.

This is most clearly illustrated by his complete trust in God's revelation in a dream to take Mary as his wife for she had conceived the Saviour of the world (cf Mt 1:20-21). He also heeded God's word to escape to Egypt to protect Jesus, even if it meant hardship and uncertainty. We thus see in St Joseph a true man of faith with "roots in the living waters of God's word, whose life was spent in dialogue with God and who


therefore brings forth constant fruit." (Pope Benedict XVI, *Jesus of Nazareth*)

St Joseph is thus an example of a man who was "inwardly watchful for the divine... someone with a real sensitivity for God and His ways." (ibid) By his attentiveness to God, his words and deeds were no longer his, but God's; him fully becoming an instrument of God's will; God whom St Joseph so deeply loved that he was willing to do anything and everything for.

As a result of this, God out of love towards this just man gave him the greatest gift possible, the honour of becoming the father of Jesus. The divine poetry is especially significant when we consider that God's response to St Joseph's love was to become incarnate in the person of Jesus as St Joseph's son. God, the Father of creation and the author of love itself thus chose to experience the earthly love of a father through the fatherhood of St Joseph!

In this Year of St Joseph, let us invoke

the help and intercession of St Joseph in times of trouble and despair. Asking him to help us to have a faith like his, to be able to love like him, and to be obedient to God as he was. For it is through love of God and doing his will that we will truly be able to experience God's love and providence. In the year ahead may St Joseph be for us a pattern of sanctity, especially in these uncertain times. And may we, like our forefathers before us, find strength in invoking the age-old prayer and anthem, "Ite ad Joseph!" (Go to Joseph)


Pope Francis has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 Dec 2020 to 8 Dec 2021.


In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), the Pope describes St Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

The Holy Father wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble St Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

According to the Pope, some important aspects of St Joseph that we can learn from include the following:

- 1. He trusted in the Lord, accepting even the events that he did not understand. Through St Joseph, it is as if God were to repeat to us: "Do not be afraid!" because "faith gives meaning to every event, however happy or sad," and makes us aware that "God can make flowers spring up from stony ground." Joseph "did not look for shortcuts but confronted reality with open eyes and accepted personal responsibility for it." For this reason, "he encourages us to accept and welcome others as they are, without exception, and to show special concern for the weak".
- 2. Happiness for Joseph involved a true gift of self." In him, we never see frustration, but only trust," writes the Pope. "His patient silence was the prelude to concrete expressions of trust." Joseph stands out, therefore, as an exemplary figure for our time, in a world that "needs fathers," and not "tyrants"; a society that "rejects those who confuse authority with authoritarianism, service with servility, discussion with oppression, charity with a welfare mentality, power with destruction."

Father, may Your love and grace ignite our hearts and lead us to launch a new era of faith, so that we may once again be a more vibrant, evangelising and missionary Church. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.
