Finding Jesus

Epiphany of the Lord 3 Jan 2021

Isa 60:1-6 Eph 3:2-3, 5-6 Mt 2:1-12

"The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast in Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighbouring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the lews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the lews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that "the full number of the nations" now takes its "place in the family of the patriarchs", and acquires Israelitica dignitas (is made 'worthy of the heritage of Israel')." CCC 528

The *magi* were learned men who scrutinised Scriptures and the cosmos, and who obviously knew about other peoples, cultures and religions. In their own countries, they would most likely be secure in terms of income and respectability amongst their own people. Yet, in embarking on what must be a perilous journey, away from the comforts of home to find the newly

born King of the Jews, they must have had a restless heart, seeking something greater than temporal well-being and security. A heart that was driven by a deep desire to know that God exists, driven by a yearning to know who he is and what he is like. Guided by divine revelation and the light of reason, their restless hearts and desire to know God culminates in "great joy" (Mt 2:10) when they finally come face to face with the Messiah child with his mother.

Thus, the magi give us a model of the characteristics we need to adopt in responding to the light of the Holy Spirit with a desire to find and know the person of Jesus ever more deeply who is the only source of true joy. In order to do this, we too like the magi must bring our gifts of gold, which is like the wisdom that God puts in each of us to listen, read and study scriptures so that we can learn what it is that God wants us to know about him. Regularly, we must bring our gifts of frankincense which are our prayers and worship of God in the Liturgy of the Mass. And finally our gifts of myrrh, which is presenting ourselves as "a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is our spiritual worship." (Rom 12:1)

Ever since the fall of Adam,

beginning in the garden of Eden when God called to Adam saying "Where are you?" (Gen 3:1-9), salvation history has been about God seeking us so as to reverse the sin of man and restore us into the joy of a right relationship with him. In the Epiphany, God shows us his relentless love, revealing to us that in Jesus, God has become one of us in order that we might become like him. And lesus is not difficult to find if we, like the shepherds (see Lk 2:8-20) and the magi, have hearts that are humble and open to God's revelations and promptings. We must not be like the chief priests and scribes of Herod's court who knew where the Messiah would be born, but pride, self-assuredness, presumptuous knowledge and the lack of authentic humility prevented them from ever finding Jesus.

Whether our present lives are filled with comfort and security, or mired in difficulties, the magi show us that we can find great joy when we turn from ourselves to seek God and to worship him. And when we find Jesus, like the magi who departed to their own country by another way, we must live our lives on earth differently until we find our home in God.


HOW CAN WE PRAY FOR YOU?

As the demand for seats outweighs availability for many masses, we request everyone to book only if you know your attendance is confirmed. In the event you are unable to attend due to unforeseen circumstances, please cancel your booking early no later than 48 hours before the mass, to allow those who are waiting for a vacancy, to apply. There will be two check-in points via the Main Church foyer & outside JPII Hall. Please come 30 minutes earlier and bring along your photo identification card for MARS booking verification.

TraceTogether Token/App Required: As we enter into Phase 3, each individual is required to use the TraceTogether token or phone application to enter our church premises. Scanning SafeEntry QR codes with phone cameras, or through the SingPass mobile app or barcodes on NRIC, as well as 'Group check in' will not be possible.

Blessing of the Home on the epiphany of the Lord

There is a tradition of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany when the family gather to ask God's blessing in their home and family life. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes and on all who live, work or visit us in our homes. This blessing can be done either by a priest or an adult in the family using a blessed chalk mark the lintel of your front door as follows:

20 + C + M + B + 21

saying:

"The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and nineteen years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen."

Then say the following prayer:

"Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and for ever. Amen."

Meaning of the symbols:

First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house."

The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "21" at the end mark the year.

Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stays with those who dwell therein and reminds us to be as welcoming to all who visit us!
