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# Connection and attunement to God

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 7 Feb 2021

Job 7: 1-4,6-7

1 Cor 9: 16-19,22-23

Mk 1: 29-39

Perhaps the most difficult part about sickness is the sense of isolation and disconnection it brings. Last week, Jesus exorcised an unclean spirit and spiritually healed a man. This week, he heals Peter's motherin-law who was very sick. Although our lectionary translation says she had a "fever" - merely an increase in body temperature to us - it was highly likely she was at death's door. Imagine how Peter's mother-in-law must have been: lying flat on her back with no energy, no enthusiasm, separated from family, friends and her usual activities. She is confined to a horizontal existence.

Similarly, we may have experienced this kind of illness that leaves us horizontal and disconnected from what gives meaning to our lives, contentment in our relationships, and purpose in what we do. We see this in Job's lamentations in the First Reading. We know that Job had lost everything he held dear - his health and fortune, his family and friends, and at one point even his deepest identity. Although Job eventually had a happy resolution, the few short passages of the First Reading highlights the sense of anguish, disconnection, isolation, abandonment he felt at his lowest.

In response, Psalm 147 encourages us to "praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted." The anticipation and promise of healing and restoration is at the heart of this week's readings. And this promise is fulfilled by Jesus who comes into our humanity, into our lives, and

into our sickness. Jesus took the hand of Peter's mother-in-law and helped her up. This raising up is the same word that Mark uses to describe the resurrection (Mk 16:6). Mark suggests that this is not just the physical healing of a bodily ailment, but a spiritual life-giving renewal. Jesus broke her fever, restored her vertical connection, and renewed all other connections in her life.

Just as he had done for Peter's mother-in-law, he also "cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another." (Mk 1:34) Jesus' ministry of bringing healing and restoration was so compelling, he hurried to other neighbouring villages just as he was gaining fame. Instead of staying in a comfortable place and receiving from those who have benefitted from his healing, he decided to head to unfamiliar ground and risk uncertainty, so that even more may come to know the love of God.

Equally noteworthy is Jesus' steadfast relationship with God. Mark tells us, "In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there." (Mk 1:35) Pope Francis in his homily (First Sunday of Advent, 29 Nov 2020) also affirms our need for time set aside for God: "Prayer rouses"

us from the tepidity of a purely horizontal existence and makes us lift our gaze to higher things; it makes us attuned to the Lord." Those of us who have struggled to rise before dawn to pray or exercise will know just how much willpower is needed to overcome our human weakness. Yet Jesus prioritises his attunement to God, and subsequently God's will and mission, at the cost of his own human needs.

The cost and sacrifice of preaching the Good News is echoed in St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians: "So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could." (1 Cor 9:19) St Paul teaches us to emulate Jesus in the urgency of the mission and in his willing surrender of everything for the sake of preaching the Good News, to bring healing and restoration to others.

This Sunday, we should ponder on the times that Jesus has restored our health, our vertical connection to the divine, and all the goodness that flows from it. Have I prioritised this relationship and connection with God in my life? Am I willing to sacrifice and give my all for the sake of the Good News, and for the sake of the healing and restoration of others?
