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Cleanse me, Lord!


6th Sunday in Ordinary Time 14 Feb 2021

Lev 13:1-2,44-46 1 Cor 10:31-11:1 Mk 1:40-45

The Lunar New Year holidays have been muted and constrained this year. With the Coronavirus pandemic now into its second year, new mutations spreading, and tens of thousands out of work, we as Church, the mystical Body of Christ, must reach out to those in despair to show our fraternal solidarity with them for we are one human family (Fratelli Tutti, All Brothers 8).

In his message for the 29th World Day of the Sick which we celebrated just three days ago on the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, our Holy Father Pope Francis, called on us to show this solidarity in a relational way so that there is a holistic healing. He says we should look into the faces of the most vulnerable, even touch their flesh, sense their closeness and help them. He reminded us that Jesus healed "not by magic but as the result of an encounter, an interpersonal relationship."

Looking at today's gospel, we can see that the leper was restored in a very profound way through his encounter with Jesus. He had heard how Jesus healed the grievously sick, he intuited that God's power must be in Jesus - with great faith and at the risk of breaking the law (for lepers were "unclean" and must live away from others - Lev 13:46), he had entered the city, approached Jesus and pleaded on his knees, "If you want to...you can cure me." (Mk 1:40) Feeling deep compassion, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him saying, "Of course I want to! Be cured!" The leprosy left the man at



once. Knowing that only God could heal leprosy as the Old Testament account of Naaman's healing had revealed (cf 2 Kgs 5:7, 15), the leper rejoiced for he was not only made clean but he had just encountered God in lesus!

Mark tells us that the leper told so many people about Jesus that "Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived." In cleansing the leper, Jesus had traded places with him – Jesus himself was now forced to live like a leper in isolation because of the throngs seeking him while the man went about "freely... everywhere." (Mk 1:45)

Mark narrates this detail for a theological purpose as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explains, "[Since] it was the priests' duty to diagnose [leprosy] and to declare unclean the sick person...leprosy constituted a kind of religious and civil death, and its healing a kind of resurrection. This miracle thus has a strong symbolic value. Jesus 'has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows' (Is 53:4). In his Passion he will become as a leper, made impure by our sins, separated from God: he will do all this out of love, to obtain for us reconciliation, forgiveness and salvation." (Angelus, 15 Feb 2009)

May we allow Christ's Passion to convert us once more as the season of Lent begins this Wednesday.

The blood and water from Christ's pierced side are his sacramental gifts of the Eucharist and Baptism to us. In Baptism, we have already been reconciled, forgiven and saved by Christ but through weakness, many of us will become leprous with sin again. With the deep faith of the leper, we must approach Christ in the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation to heal us of the sores we have inflicted on our immortal soul. Pope Emeritus urges us to seek purification in Confession because "in the Sacrament of Penance, the Crucified and Risen Christ purifies us through his ministers with his infinite mercy...and makes us a gift of his love, his joy and his peace. The sins that we commit distance us from God and, if we do not humbly confess them, trusting in divine mercy, they will finally bring about the death of the soul."

Sickness and death are topics usually shunned at Lunar New Year gatherings but with the pandemic, end-of-life matters have become a pre-occupation for many. Let us then bring hope by boldly sharing our own joyful encounters of Christ's mercy and healing. Like the leper, may our proclamations lead others to Christ. Acknowledging one's sinfulness, always trusting in Christ's mercy and in humility plea, "Cleanse me, Lord!" – that is the true festivity. That is the true and most joyous "Huat Ah!"


