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55th World Communications Day

7th Sunday of Easter 16 May 2021

Ac 1:15-17,20a,20c-26 1 Jn 4:11-16 Jn 17:11b-19

This week, we celebrate the 7th Sunday of Easter as well as World Communications Day. Pope St John Paul II says in *Redemptoris Missio 37:* "The world of communications is the first Areopagus* of the modern age, unifying humanity and turning it into what is known as a 'global village'. The communications media have acquired such importance as to be for many the chief means of information and education, of guidance and inspiration for many people in their personal, family and social behaviour."

Indeed, from the time of the Second Vatican Council, we as a Church have had to acknowledge the necessity of using the media to fully engage with the world. We have the responsibility to master the use of new media, for the purpose of evangelisation – of bringing good news to peoples everywhere. Yet, it is not just about providing pieces of information and facts.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI says in *Spe Salvi 2:* "Christianity was not only 'good news' – the communication of a hitherto unknown content... the Christian message was not only 'informative' but 'performative.' That means, the Gospel is not merely a communication of things that can be known – it is one that makes things happen and is life-changing."

In his message for the 55th World Communications Day, Pope Francis focuses on the power of technology and new media to facilitate such a life-changing encounter with people.

The words "come and see" echoes Jesus' constant invitation to the many people he meets, where they are and as they are, drawing them deeper into relationship with him.

Pope Francis says in his message: "Any instrument proves useful and valuable only to the extent that it motivates us to go out and see things that we otherwise would not know about, to post on the internet news that would not be available elsewhere, to allow for encounters that otherwise would never happen." Our use of media should amplify Jesus' invitation and enable encounters in all the ways that were previously not possible.

Upon reflection of our own media usage as content generators – as bloggers, micro-bloggers, comment leavers, message forwarders – are we magnifying the Good News by facilitating an openness to a genuine heartfelt encounter? Or are we bombarding others with mere information and closing off any attempts to reach out for connection?

The philosopher Hannah Arendt warns of the possibility of alienation,

division, and hostility that this powerful instrument can bring, even as she acknowledges its potential to connect people. She describes her observations in *The Human Condition*, "To live together in the world means essentially that a world of things is between those who have it in common, as a table is located between those who sit around it; the world, like every in-between, relates and separates men at the same time."

We should further ask ourselves, how can we use technology in a way that unites us more than it divides? Particularly in these times when social distancing has compelled us to turn to technology, has our over reliance on the myriad of gadgets and apps caused a neglect of those who need connection the most? How should we create spaces in social media to have mutual dialogues and avoid echo chambers that lead to extreme polarisation of views?

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' reminder and prayer for all of us: "I am not asking you to remove them from the world but to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth; your word is truth." (Jn 17:15-17)

Jesus does not ask us to renounce the use of technology and new media, but to master it instead of becoming slaves to it. Jesus consecrates us in his truth and sends us into the world to be heralds of his Good News. May we remain connected to God and to the world, so that his truth may indeed reach the ends of the earth.

PHASE 2 Heightened Alert Updates



Due to the increased number of Covid-19 community cases, stricter safety measures have been imposed and announced by the Covid-19 Multi-ministry Taskforce. This means that all Masses for the period of 16 May to 13 June 2021 will be limited to only 50 persons per Mass. In view of this reduced congregational size for Masses during the affected time frame, please note the following changes in our Parish:

1. CANCELLATION OF ALL SUNDAY MASSES ON 16 MAY

All physical Masses for this Sunday 16 May will be cancelled. Under the revised Phase 2 heightened measures, parishes would need time to implement the revised measures required by MCCY and for the Mass re-bookings to take place. We would like to encourage parishioners to attend online Masses instead for this Sunday at **www.catholic.sg/mass**.

2. REBOOKING OF MASSES

It will take place this **Sun 16 May, 12pm** at **https://mycatholic.sg**. All Mass bookings are to be done via MARS and no walk-ins are allowed for all Masses. **The date for the fourth and fifth bookings for weekend Masses in May remains unchanged on Tue 18 May at 12pm**, subject to availability.

3. CHANGE OF MASS VENUE

Our Main Church wil be closed and all Masses from 17 - 31 May will be held at JPII Hall. Check in will be at The Plaza (outside JPII Hall). No walk-ins are allowed for all Masses. Please promptly leave the premises once mass is over.

4. COLUMBARIUM VISITS & CONFESSION

Both will be suspended until further notice.
