





Have Faith in FAITH

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 Jun 2021

Ez 17: 22 - 24 2 Cor 5:6-10 Mk 4:26 - 34

In today's gospel, Jesus invites us to have faith in the power of the FAITH which has been transmitted by the Apostles – the FAITH we celebrate in the sacraments. Our Holy Father and Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI tell us that most especially, the Creed we profess every Sunday has an intrinsic power to do what Jesus says this seed of FAITH can do: sprout and grow to become a shelter for anyone seeking flight from the chaos in the world.

The Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed (Profession of Faith) is not to be seen as abstract truths but serves to transform us, "...in the creed believers are invited to enter into the mystery which they profess and to be transformed by it... [T]he creed has a trinitarian structure: the Father and the Son are united in the Spirit of love. The believer thus states that...the inmost secret of all reality, is the divine communion. The creed also contains a christological confession: it takes us through all the mysteries of Christ's life up to his death, resurrection and ascension into heaven...It tells us that this God of communion... is capable of embracing all of human history and drawing it into the dynamic unity of the Godhead, which has its source and fulfilment in the Father. The believer...cannot truthfully recite the words of the creed without being changed, without becoming part of that history of love which embraces us and expands our being, making it part of a great fellowship ..." (Lumen Fidei,

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"The Light of Faith", 45)

Hence, an interiority of the credal truths from the Councils of Nicea (325AD) and Constantinople (381AD) are necessary for salvation "for Faith without truth does not save, it does not provide a sure footing. It remains a beautiful story ... reduced to a lofty sentiment...incapable of sustaining a steady journey through life." (LF 24) Church Doctor St Augustine has also affirmed the need for *fides quae* (doctrinal content) to guide *fides* qua (personal claims of faith): "the faith which is etched in the heart of everyone who believes [should] ... proceed from a single doctrine" (de Trinitate, "On the Trinity", XIII, 2, 5).

With Corpus Christi last Sunday, the Church has concluded highlighting the fullness of divine revelation and God's sacramental saving help by way of celebrating major feasts. We now enter the second period of Ordinary Time (until Advent) where we place ourselves under the Holy Spirit to continue the *mystagogy* – the deepening awareness of how the mysteries celebrated and the FAITH we profess conform us to Christ. Ordinary Time is therefore not "ordinary" as if it lacks wonder and discovery! Rather, we continue to "sprout and grow" as we learn to live "by faith and not by sight." (2 Cor 5:7)



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> An aspect of credal FAITH which the Fathers of Vatican II urge on us is that Christ is "the life of the world." By his Incarnation and Passion, he has planted a "Godlike seed" into every man on his "noble destiny" - to be rescued by Christ from sin and commune in God's love (Gaudium et Spes, "Joy & Hope", 3). Pope St John Paul II highlighted this reality unreservedly: Christ is Salvatore Mundi - Saviour of the world, "...every man without any exception whatever - has been redeemed by Christ... with each man without any exception whatever - Christ is in a way united, even when man is unaware of it: 'Christ, who died and was raised up for all, provides man' - each man and every man- 'with the light and the strength to measure up to his supreme calling." (Redemptor Hominis, "The Redeemer of Man", 14)

> The Apostles lived out Jesus' parables of the Sower and the Mustard Seed. They each became the "man" who threw the seeds of FAITH with faith – seeds that have proved their intrinsic power because year after year for over 2000 years, this FAITH continues to attract with the mystery of love Christ poured out from the cross. It is now our turn to scatter these seeds of saving love and apostolic faith that others may also "sprout and grow" in the perfect love of Christ.
