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## The Assumption of Our Lady

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

15 Aug 2021

Rev 11:19, 12:1-6, 10 1 Cor 15:20-27 Lk 1:39-56

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the bodily taking up of Mary into heaven at the end of her earthly life. One of the four Marian dogmas in the Church – the others being Mary's Immaculate Conception, her Perpetual Virginity and her Divine Motherhood – our belief in Mary's direct assumption into heaven is rooted in both Tradition and Scripture, and coheres with the Church's theological teachings.

Historically, a litany of early Church Fathers and Doctors have spoken of Mary's Assumption as something already known and accepted. These saints include St John Damascene, St Germanus of Constantinopole, and St Anthony of Padua, to name but a few. The numerous churches, sacred images, and patronages also attest to the faith in this event. And of course, in the Rosary, one of the Glorious Mysteries is the Assumption of Mary.

Accordingly, both the Eastern and Western liturgies have commemorated Mary's privilege of being assumed directly into heaven. In the Roman Catholic liturgy, St Sergius I had established the Dormition of the Virgin Mary as one of the four Marian feasts as early as the 7<sup>th</sup> century.

**Theologically**, Mary's Assumption follows from her Immaculate Conception. In general, the full effect of Christ's victory over sin and death is granted only at the coming of the end of time. As such, even the bodies of the righteous experience

corruption after death.

However, God had willed that Mary, whose holiness is exalted above all men and angels, be exempted from this rule. By a special grace, Mary overcame sin by her Immaculate Conception. Consequently, she was not subject to corruption of the grave and she did not have to wait until the end of time for the redemption of her body. Since the days of the early Church, theologians have also argued that Jesus had willed for Mary to be assumed into heaven out of his filial love for his mother.



"[By] the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

Pope Pius XII, Munificentissimus Deus Scripturally, several passages have traditionally been interpreted to refer to Mary's unique status and privilege as Mother of God (Divine Motherhood), forming the basis of our belief in the Assumption. This Sunday's First Reading is illustrative: the scholastic Doctors recognized the woman clothed with the sun in Revelation as the fulfilment of the unique grace granted to Mary, as signified by the Assumption of Mary. Our gospel also alludes to Mary's exalted place in God's salvific plan, setting the stage for the declaration that her body remained incorrupt even as her virginity remained intact.

These developments culminated in the proclamation of the dogma – in *Munificentissimus Deus* on 1 November 1950 by Pope Pius XII – that "the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory". Building on this dogma, *Lumen Gentium* added that Mary was "exalted by the Lord as Queen of the universe, that she might be more fully conformed [in heaven] to her Son". (*LG* 59)

In Catholic theology today, the Assumption of Mary is also derived from her participation in Christ's resurrection, and accordingly, it is "an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians", as stated in CCC 966. Our Lady has thus become an eschatological icon. In her, we "contemplate what [the Church] will be in the homeland at the end of her journey", even as the Church is "awaited by the one she venerates as Mother of her Lord and as her own mother".

As we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary this Sunday, let us also fix our sights on our ultimate end and place our hope in Christ's resurrection, that we may also someday join him in his heavenly glory just as his Mother did at the end of her life.

# What does the Assumption of Mary mean for us

The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary recalls when Mary was taken, body and soul, to heaven. But what does this mean for us ordinary Catholics and mere humans?

Mary's Assumption is our hope. After Jesus, she is the first to have her body glorified. This glorification of the body is something promised to all the faithful, at the end of time. Mary is the first to experience it, and her glorification helps us to look forward with hope to our own.

Mary's Assumption also reminds us of what our suffering will lead to. Regardless of what our vocation is - consecrated celibacy, priesthood, religious life, marriage etc. - we will suffer for the sake of Christ. It is easy to feel discouraged when facing this suffering but then, we can look to Mary. She reminds us that suffering

is not without meaning. Christ calls us to take up our crosses, but he only does so in order that we learn to love as he does. In the end, like Mary, he will turn our sorrow to joy.

Mary's Assumption also means that God's glory is reflected through her body and soul. She is therefore uniquely positioned to help us grow in holiness, if we ask for her intercession.

With this rich understanding of Mary and a tradition of giving her the honour she deserves, Mary can teach us a lot through her example of virtue. Pray with Mary and she will lead you into a far deeper relationship with Her Son than you could ever achieve by your own direction.

Hail Mary!



This **Tuesday**, **17 August 8pm**, as part of the Catholic200SG Intercessory Prayers, a group of SFX parishioners from various ministries will be leading the session and meditating on the Seven Joys of Mary.

Many of us would have heard of the seven sorrows of Mary and may have meditated on the Chaplet of Seven Sorrows but most of us may not be familiar with the Seven Joys of Mary or the Franciscan Crown Rosary. According to Franciscan tradition, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to a Franciscan novice in 1442. The novice had a devotion to our Lady and would adorn her statue with a crown of roses daily. But when he entered the Friars Minor, he was not able to offer this gift and wanted to leave. Our Lady appeared to him and told him not to leave. She then instructed him to weave a crown of prayers and taught him the Rosary of Seven Joys.

The Franciscan Crown Rosary consists of seven decades of 1 Our Father

and 10 Hail Marys with each decade describing a joyful event in the life our Blessed Mother. The Seven Joys are the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Birth of Christ, the Adoration of the Magi, the Finding of the Child Jesus, the Appearance of Christ after the Resurrection and the Assumption and Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven.

We will be celebrating the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary on 15 August and what a joy it will be to reflect on our Blessed Mother's Seven Joys. Come join us and intercede as One Parish and One Church!
