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Participating in the Redemptive Suffering of Christ

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time 12 September 2021

Is 50: 5-9a Jm 2: 14-18 Mk 8:27-35

The contrast between the *Confessio* of St. Peter and his immediate rebuke by Jesus epitomises the tension we face each day, as Children of God negotiating a secular world. While St Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ (i.e. Messiah) was divinely revealed, his quick return to 'reality' saw him unable to accept Jesus' desire to redeem mankind through His suffering and death (Mk 8: 31-35).

St Peter's remonstration with Christ, might seem to be a humanly rational and sensible act. What leader would exchange his large room for the smallest cubicle in the office? How then, could Jesus - the longawaited messiah - allow himself to suffer grievously in the hands of his own subjects? In this light, we may be inclined to St Peter's position, a pragmatically logical one. Yet this is not the way of Jesus. Unlike the worldly ways of man, the Cross was the way of Christ, the way of suffering for our redemption -Redemptive Suffering (St John Paul II -Salvifici Doloris).

The aversion to pain and suffering is primordially ingrained in the human condition. Given the choice between two paths leading to the same goal, one with hardship the other without, ceteris paribus, the latter would be the obvious choice. Thus, if we are unwilling to suffer for personal gain, what of suffering for the benefit of others?

Christ resolves this dilemma by showing how love overcomes the human aversion to suffering. For love gives meaning and flavour to the Christian notion of redemptive suffering; and is the very reason why Christ sacrificed himself for us. God, for love of us deigned to sacrifice himself to save us: the Source and Creator of all things was incarnate as the created that He may suffer at the hands of His creation for their redemption. This great revelation is the central Christological mission; and contemplating this stupendous act of love must likewise draw us closer to God. Such was God's love for us that He was willing to forgo His divinity for our humanity, with little regard for his own earthly life. Love must therefore motivate us to give ourselves entirely to others, just as Christ did for us, even if it means suffering grievously.

St John of the Cross OCD poignantly notes: "Love consists not in feeling great things but in having great detachment and in suffering for the Beloved". As disciples of Christ, we are called to live out our confessio daily: taking up our crosses to follow Him. This is no easy task. Often, like Peter, though cognisant of our Christological vocation to walk with Christ, we are tempted by the pervasive worldliness that surrounds us. We thus choose logic over love, pragmatism over faith;

disavowing this call and shunning hardship in place of self-preservation and aggrandisement.

Cultivating Christian discipleship upon sacrifice therefore requires practice, for faith is not something merely lived within the mind or exercised within the heart. Renouncing oneself and taking up our cross is as much a corporal act as it is an act of faith (James 2: 14-18). Practicing self-mortification is thus a simple act that trains our bodies in order that our souls may be better disposed to the divine (St Paul VI, Paenitemini).

Simple acts of self-denial need not be constrained to Lent but can be practiced daily when we choose to endure some form of discomfort for love of Christ and the desire to carry our crosses more closely with Him. This can take the form of abstinence from sugar in our coffee, watching less TV, not employing the snooze button in the morning, or can even be practiced when we order something we least prefer on the restaurant menu.

Indeed, the graces obtained by such sufferings in turn help us to better endure greater hardships for Christ (Is 50: 5-9a), better disposing us to live out our Christian vocation through the participation of redemptive suffering – the complete giving of ourselves for others motivated by Love.


CPS LUNCHTIME ZOOM TALKS: 'COMING HOME TO OUR FATHER' BY NICK JARVIS TAN
