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# **Authentic Service for God**

26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 26 September 2021

Nm 11:25 - 29 Jm 5:1 - 6 Mk 9:38 - 43, 45, 47 - 48

In last week's Gospel, Jesus taught his disciples that true greatness comes from humble service of others. In this week's Gospel reading, Jesus continues the formation of his disciples, telling John not to stop an exorcist who was not a disciple, but working in Jesus' name. John's action may have stemmed from frustration with his own earlier perform exorcisms failure to (Mark 9:14 - 29). The disciples might have felt that they were more "qualified" to cast out demons as compared to others who are non-followers of Jesus. might motivated Envy have their curtailment of ministry in Jesus' name.

Today's Gospel incident invites us to reflect on our own interior responses when it comes to ministry and service of others and particularly within Church. St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians about how jealousy and strife prevented them from receiving solid spiritual food (1 Cor 3:1-3). Likewise, our interior approach to service of the Lord and others may well hamper fruitfulness.

Many of us enter ministry and service with much of our own brokenness. For some, self-worth is very much dependent on whether we can show greater success compared to and in lieu of others. Many a times we carry this brokenness into our service of God, trying to prove our worth rather than serving God authentically. We become slaves when we choose to

serve anyone or anything else other than God. Do we seek to glorify God in all the work that we do? Or are we expecting some form of personal glory when we are serving Him? Many a times our "services" and "ministry" is a projection of our own self-centredness, self-preservation, egoism and pride.

Can we serve God and/or others without expecting anything? Is it wrong to feel good about ourselves when serving God? Is it bad to accept praise and reward for services to God and others? This very much depends on the motivation of our hearts in responding to the call to serve. Authentic service to the Lord and others must first be motivated by a love of God and carried out in a "hidden" way, far from the glare and publicity of earthly grandeur. The purity of motivation for service will come from being a discerning disciple of Christ, rooted in a deep relationship with God and finding God in all things and for the greater glory of him, who first loved us. St Thérèse of Lisieux once said, "Remember that nothing is small in the eyes of God. Do all that you do with love."

An opportunity for authentic service arises today as the Church celebrates World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR), which has been celebrated on the last Sunday of September since 1914. This year, the Holy Father Pope Francis has chosen the

theme, "Towards an ever wider 'We'". In the first paragraph of his WDMR message, he reminded us of what he wrote in his third Encyclical Fratelli Tutti (which means "All Brothers", published on 3rd October 2020), and that "once this health crisis passes, our worst response would be to plunge even more deeply into feverish consumerism and new forms of egoistic self-preservation. God willing, after all this, we will think no longer in terms of 'them' and 'those' but only 'us"". He also reminded us that "Salvation history... has a 'we' in its beginning and 'we' at its end, and at its centre the mystery of Christ, who died and rose so that they may all be one." He attributed this brokenness to our "myopic and aggressive forms of nationalism (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 11) and radical individualism (cf. ibid., 105). And the highest price is being paid by those who most easily become viewed as 'others': foreigners, migrants, the marginalized, those living on the existential peripheries." Once again, this message points us towards humble service of others because we are all one people in the eyes of God.

May the Gospel reading today and the admonishment of the second reading from St. James, spur us not only to be of service to God and our neighbour, but also serve with a pure heart, using all that God has given us, withholding nothing.
