Marital Indissolubility – A Pathway to Divine Love

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time 3 Oct 2021

Gen 2:18 - 24 Hebr 2:9 - 11 Mk 10:2 - 16

"Each marriage is a kind of 'salvation history', which from fragile beginnings...grows over time into something precious and enduring... the greatest mission of two people in love is to help one another become, respectively, more a man and more a woman...helping a person to shape his or her own identity...Love is thus a kind of craftsmanship." (Pope Francis, Amoris Laetitia, "Love in the Family" 221)

Today's first reading takes us to the very beginning of this "salvation history by marriage." God creates Eve from Adam to be his "helpmate" in his solitude (Gen 2:18). Created from Adam's side, from one of his ribs and "enclosed...in [his] flesh", God's gift of Eve elicits ecstasy from Adam, "This at last is bone from my bones and flesh from my flesh!" (Gen 2:23) They are now an indissoluble "one body" (Gen 2:24). By their union, they imitate in the flesh God's generosity and fecundity (CCC 2335).

Marriage is "salvation history" in that family life brings God's personal love for man into clear view. This bliss rings out in today's responsorial psalm as the Psalmist acknowledges domestic flourishing to be contingent on God: "O blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways! By the labour of

your hands you shall eat...be happy and prosper. Your wife like a fruitful vine...your children like shoots of the olive, around your table."


Sadly, over 7,000 couples each year have lost this blessedness in seeking divorce or annulment. The Catechism sees this rupture as arising from sin - "domination, infidelity, jealousy...conflicts...lust." (CCC 1607) Our Holy Father suggests humility and patience in challenging times, "Once it becomes apparent that the reality is more limited and challenging than one imagined, the solution is not to think quickly and irresponsibly about separation, but to come to the sober realization that married life is a process of growth, in which each spouse is God's means of helping the other to mature."

This maturing by patiently enduring familial trials and by "following Christ, renouncing themselves, and taking up their crosses" (CCC 1615) contributes to the holiness of the couple. It garners the priceless reward of being "transfigured" in divine love - God's deepest purpose for marriage as Venerable Fulton Sheen explained in his book, "Three To Get Married":

"All love is a flight towards immortality. There is a suggestion of Divine Love in every form of erotic love...Sex is only the selfstarter on the motor of the family... The begetting of children enlarges the field of service and loving sacrifice... In a well-regulated moral heart, as time goes on, the erotic love diminishes and the religious love increases...the love of God increases...not in the sense that husband and wife love one another less, but that they love God more... There are few things more beautiful in life than to see that deep passion of man for woman, which begot children, transfigured into that deeper passion for the Spirit of God."

Eros - the love between a man and a woman has today been "impoverished" by being reduced to pure "sex" (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Deus Caritas Est, "On Christian Love",5) In the Song of Songs, Hosea and Ezekiel, true love is depicted as both eros and agape - it is both a seeking, possessive love and a love that pours itself out for the beloved to raise him up: "God's passionate love for his people—for humanity is at the same time a forgiving love. It is so great that it turns God against himself, his love against his justice... so great is God's love for man that by becoming man he follows him even into death..." (DCE 10)

In today's gospel, Jesus affirmed the divine origin and the indissolubility of marriage: "...from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave his father and mother, and the two become one body...what God has united, man must not divide." (Mk 10:6-9) Let us remember that Christ became man, suffered and died for us because true love is an *eros* that is *agape* – it clings on to the loved one and suffers to perfect the beloved.

The 15 Promises of the Rosary

5 PROMISES of the VIRGIN MARY FOR THOSE WHO PRAY THE ROSARY



- Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the rosary, shall receive signal graces.
- 4 It will cause virtue and good works to flourish..Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 7 Whoever shall have a true devotion for the rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
- 10 The faithful children of the rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in heaven.
- 13 All the advocates of the rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.

- 2 I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the rosary.
- 5 The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the rosary shall not perish.
- 8 Those who are faithful to recite the rosary shall have, during their life and at their death, the light of God.


- Make the Sign of the Cross & recite the Apostles' Creed.
- Recite the Our Father.
- Recite three Hail Marys.
- Recite the Glory Be.
- 6 Announce the first mystery and recite the Our Father.
- Recite ten Hail Marys.
- Recite the Glory Be and the Fatima Prayer.
- Announce the second mystery. Recite the Our Father and repeat the steps throught the rosary.
- 9 After completing the mysteries, recite the Hail Holy Queen & end with the Sign of the Cross.
