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We are all Bartimaeus


We are all Bartimaeus!

At first sight, this might seem an odd thing to say. As recounted in today's Gospel reading, the man was a pitiful sight along the road from Jericho to Jerusalem when Jesus passed by heading for the Holy City. He was blind and a beggar. Yet, Mark's story speaks to each of us and our struggle with our own "blindness."

Unlike Bartimaeus who knew exactly what his defect was, too many of us fail to recognise our shortcomings and acknowledge that we are even blinder than Blind Bartimaeus.

What we cannot see is not the physical world but who we really are and what is important in our life. When we continue to seek earthly pleasures and pursue wealth and status single-mindedly, despite knowing that it will never give us true peace and happiness, our shortsightedness is blinding.

But we are also Bartimaeus because like him we often yearn for God's help. We know there is something missing in our life when we are apart from God and every one of us has at some time or other, like Bartimaeus, cried out: "Master, let me see again." (Mk 10:51) What we desire to see is a closer relationship with God so that we may truly understand his love for us and be better able to fulfil his will. We want our sight of God restored to what he originally intended when he created us in his image.

Like Bartimaeus we want to throw off the cloak that weighs us down and gives false protection against the ills of the world. If we could only dispose of it the way Bartimaeus did, we would discard our old self and seek a renewed life as our Lord's disciple.

But do we have the courage to do so?

For Bartimaeus, wanting his sight back was the most natural thing for him to ask the Lord.

But our spiritual blindness may not be so obvious, especially when we are living too comfortable a life. It requires courage to reject our present life and transform it in the way Jesus wants us to do. Will we be prepared when he asks us, as he did Bartimaeus, "What do you want me to do for you?" Will we be as quick with our answer or are we more likely to hesitate and demur, unsure of what we want to give up?

Bartimaeus' life was completely changed when his sight was restored. We too must believe that when we are able to see God and what he wants for us, we will become transformed and see life in a new way.

What was it that Bartimaeus had which made him so ready for the Lord? Jesus knew the answer immediately when he said to him: "Go, your faith has saved you." (Mk 10:52) Faith is what enables us to see God. As explained in the

Catechism, "Faith makes us taste in advance the light of the beatific vision, the goal of our journey here below. Then we shall see God 'face to face' as he is. So faith is already the beginning of eternal life." (CCC 163)

Our spiritual journey to come face to face with God is no different from the exiled Jews in the first reading. While they were looking forward to the end of the Babylonian exile, we struggle in the modern secular world with its earthly temptations and man-made problems. As exiles in this world, we too will find God by our side and his comforting words of hope and promise.

"They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble." (Jer 31:9) To hear these words, we have to respond with faith when Jesus calls us. As others notice our growing faith, Pope Francis says our persistent reliance on God becomes missionary - "a privileged occasion for anointing everything and everyone with the Spirit of the Lord." (Message for Mission Sunday)

Trusting in God's guidance, let us then not be afraid to admit that we are all Bartimaeus!


