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Jesus, Ruler of my Life

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time 31 Oct 2021

Deut 6:2-6 Heb 7:23-28 Mk 12:28b-34

Many of us have a life maxim or a philosophy that we live by. Perhaps something like "Family first", or "Health is Wealth", or maybe even "Carpe Diem (Seize the day!)" There were many laws in the Jewish tradition, 613 to be precise. But out of them all, which exactly is of utmost importance? Is there one that is absolutely above all others? That was the question of the scribe in today's Gospel.

Jesus directs us firstly to the Shema from Deuteronomy 6. This is a well-known and defining verse which distinguishes the Jews from all other peoples. Jesus does not give them something entirely new and foreign, but draws them back to the heart of all the other laws. Instead of negating the Old Law, this New Law that Jesus gives "fulfills," refines, surpasses, and leads the Old Law to its perfection." (CCC 1967)

Jesus continues, "The second is this, you shall love your neighbour as yourself." It is striking that these two commandments are not prohibitions (You shall not) but prescriptions (You shall), which we would need the help of the Holy Spirit to abide by: "The New Law is the grace of the Holy Spirit given to the faithful through faith in Christ." (CCC 1966) This kind of right living is reflected in everything - in our relationships with those closest to us, the movies or books we consume, our words in the comment box on social media, our behaviour and ethics at work etc. Indeed, we are called to reflect more deeply: how can I love the Lord better with all that



I am in every aspect of my life. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we will do more than avoid wrong doings, we will live by doing good.

Furthermore, by answering the scribe's question with these two commandments, Jesus insists that loving others is as equally important as loving God, and suggests that there are no conflicts between the two. We could well argue that surely there would be some circumstances in which it is necessary to prioritise God over neighbour or vice versa, neighbour over God. If we see it as vet another requirement to fulfill to be good, it will fail us. We will try to find a thousand and one scenarios to put this principle to the test and see if it holds. When we do this, our inner disposition is one of a sceptic; we wonder in disbelief how it can be so simple and think that there must be a loophole somewhere. We may even use it as a justification for our unloving actions, that we are only trying to love God over neighbour or vice versa.

But if we take this as an invitation for deeper spiritual growth, our trust in God deepens even when we are torn between conflicting values of goodness. Submitting to the guidance of the Holy Spirit includes a radical acceptance of the consequences that may result from loving and doing our best. Our inner disposition will then be one of surrender and humility, acknowledging that we may not have all the answers especially in grey situations where the most loving thing to do is not at all clear. But the grey areas are precisely where the Lord teaches us, refining our sensitivities and stretching us to hold polarities in tension.

"The New Law is called a *law of love*, because it makes us act out of the love infused by the Holy Spirit, rather than from fear; a *law of grace*, because it confers the strength of grace to act, by means of faith and the sacraments; a *law of freedom*, because it sets us free from the ritual and juridical observances of the Old Law, [and] inclines us to act spontaneously by the prompting of charity..." (CCC 1972)

If we live by any other maxim or life philosophy, we would be putting other things like family or health above God. As Christians, our lives should declare "The Lord our God is Lord alone!" May we find the grace and freedom to live out the New Law that Jesus gives everyday.



RCIY Day of Recollection 2021

RCIY met on 9 October 2021 for a Day of Recollection (DoR) for enquirers to ponder intentionally upon their journey thus far. Led by Father Cornelius, the enquirers revisited what prayer really is, and further explored the mystery of the Eucharist as Jesus' true presence. A Church tour was given to shed light on the intricacies of the mass and richness of Church tradition.

Finally, the enquirers were asked to reflect deeply upon the questions: "Where are you now? Where are you going?" The day wrapped up with an intimate Mass, during which the enquirers went through the Rite of Acceptance. Through their "yes", they move onto the next stage in this journey towards Baptism and Confirmation as Catechumens and Candidates.
