Arise!!

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 14 Nov 2021

Dan 12:1-3 Hebr 10:11-14, 18 Mk 13:24-32

Our readings this week are full of prophetic symbolism giving an indication of how God powerfully intervenes in history for iustification and sanctification. Through these readings, are invited to contemplate and celebrate the end of time when the sanctification of God's elect will be complete and all creation will behold the glory of God in a new heavenly Jerusalem.

The gospel today is taken from what is called the Olivet Discourse or "Little Apocalypse", in which Jesus foretells the destruction of the Jerusalem Temple which marked the end of biblical Judaism practiced by the Jews at the time. One interpretation of today's gospel is that Jesus is foretelling the events surrounding his second coming - the world will see Jesus "coming in clouds with great power and glory" (Mk 13:26, cf Acts 1:9-11), to "gather his elect" in the resurrection of the dead and to act as the divine judge on mankind (Jn 5:28-29). Obviously, Jesus' second coming, over 2,000 years after his Ascension, has not occurred yet and therefore, it would be difficult to reconcile this interpretation with Jesus' assertion that "this generation will not pass away before all these things take place." (Mk 13:30) Contemporary listeners of Jesus at the time would clearly understand that the events Jesus is speaking about will take place within their generation (i.e within about 40 years).

Another interpretation of today's gospel says that Jesus is speaking about his death, Resurrection and Ascension. When Jesus died on the Cross, the sun did stop shining (Lk 23:44); the earthly heaven (Jerusalem Temple) was shaken; and the Temple veil, adorned with stars and constellations was torn from top to bottom (Mt 27:51) - all of which compares well with today's gospel. Furthermore, when Jesus said "then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory" (Mk 13:26), he was using the language of Daniel 7:13 which says "behold, with the clouds of heaven there comes one like a son of man, and he came to the Ancient of Days and was presented before him." In this vision of Daniel, whilst the son of man was "coming in the clouds", he was not coming to earth but being presented to the Ancient of Days who is God the Father. So we cannot assume that the phrase "coming in the clouds" mean coming to earth! After the Ascension, with the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the Apostles would be "the angels" (which also mean "messengers") sent out to the four corners of the known world at the time, spreading the Gospel and gathering the new people of God into the new kingdom of heaven on earth which is the Church. Crucially, all these events took place and were completed in the Apostles' lifetimes which is exactly what Jesus said would happen.

The utter destruction of the Temple by the Romans in 70AD marked the end of the transition period between the old covenant and the new. It also signaled the beginning of the end of time, as we enter into the final phase of God's plan which will culminate in the resurrection of the dead, as foretold in our first reading; the renewal of creation; and a new heavenly Jerusalem where Jesus reigns supreme. Jesus refers to the

end of time as "that day or that hour" (Mk 13:32) and tells us clearly that no one but God the Father knows when the end will come. Therefore, those who are influenced by the false teachings of Rapture, must cling on to the truth of Jesus' words. Instead of trying to predict the future we must be watchful and prayerful so that whenever it comes, we will be ready.

In the meantime, Jesus has ascended into the heavenly Jerusalem to offer the perfect sacrifice of himself to God the Father for all eternity. The second reading tells us that in so doing, Jesus has completed what the Mosaic sacrifices could not, which is the forgiveness of sin and the inward transformation of our being, in order to love God and neighbour. And each time we partake of the Eucharist at Mass, we receive "the whole Christ" (CCC 1374) which conforms us to our Maker where we find our ultimate fulfilment.
