Serving the Truth through Christ the King

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 21 Nov 2021

Dan 7:13 – 14 Rev 1:5 – 8 Jn 18:33-37

Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and as disciples of Christ, we need to contemplate if Christ is indeed sovereign over our lives. What does it mean to say that Christ is sovereign over us? In today's gospel, Jesus links his kingship to being "on the side of truth." Like Christ who came to "bear witness to the truth", we are also called to serve the truth by bearing witness and living out the truth. (Jn 18:37)

Truth isn't the first idea that comes to mind when we think of kingship. Often, we mistakenly associate kingship with power and in turn, with greatness. Do all powerful political leaders exercise greatness? What does greatness really mean? In Matthew's gospel, the mother of the sons of Zebedee approached Jesus, demanding that her two sons sit next to Jesus, one on the right while the other on the left. Jesus said in reply, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?" (Mt 20:20-28) She wanted her two sons to be great. However, Jesus revealed that "greatness" for him was upholding the truth of his kingship as Lord and creator of the world even to the point of death - to the cup that he was about to drink, the sacrifice of his blood for the people. Ironically, in the meditation of the third decade of the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary, the soldiers revealed the truth about great kingship by crowning Jesus with thorns. In other words, for one to be great, he or she must be prepared to suffer greatly for others. A great leader is not one who is powerful only in name but rather one who is willing to lay down his life for others – just as Jesus did for his ignorant and sinful people.

As Christ's disciples, we are all called to deny ourselves, pick up our cross and follow Jesus (cf. Mt 16:24). We are called to follow Jesus in upholding truth. Jesus could have denied his kingship and divinity and saved himself from the cross but he persisted in the truth of his mission

to reveal the extent of God's love for sinful men and to call them to repentance and live in truth. In John 18:38, which is not reflected in today's Gospel, Pilate cynically asked, "What is truth?" For Pilate, there is only one's personal opinion and no such thing as an objective truth. Greek philosophers like Socrates, Plato and Aristotle centuries before Christ have regarded truth as a worthwhile and necessary pursuit for all human beings.

Knowing truth has great implications in life. Great philosopher-saints like St Augustine once shared that human happiness consists in the fruition of truth. St Maximilian Kolbe said "No one in the world can change Truth. What we can do and should do is to seek truth and to serve it when we have found it." The search for truth is hard work. That is why Christ our King and Saviour has given us the Holy Spirit, who is the Spirit of truth, for Christ has promised that "But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own, but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming." (Jn 16:13) Let us also not forget here that Jesus is not only the Way, the Life but also the Truth (cf. Jn 14:6) – the full truth of what it means to be human (living for others) and man's ultimate happiness (knowing and loving God) can only be found in Jesus Christ. If we have a deep relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe we can never be satisfied with the world's relativistic "truth". Nourished by the Spirit of Truth and growing in love for Christ, we can certainly follow our King and even suffer for the sake of truth!
