Who am I?

Making Disciples

3rd Sunday of Advent *Gaudete* Sunday 12 Dec 2021

Zeph 3:14-18 Phil 4:4-7 Lk 3:10-18

It is easy to lose track of one's true identity. We are labelled by wealth, power, status, achievements, even job titles. Advent reclaims the greatest existential truth of divine revelation - I am a child of God, made in the image of God (Gen 1:27). The Holy Spirit dwells in me; I am a consecrated holy temple; my mission, purpose and destiny are tied to my identity (CCC 782). *Gaudete* Sunday rejoices in the truth of our divine heritage.

Humans are embodied spirits, says St. Thomas Aquinas (ST I, q. 90, a. 2–3). Advent begins with the end in mind - **the coming of Jesus in majesty**, cataclysmic and frightening. Seen in the context of divine love and justice, our true identity transcends fear and embraces spiritual realities in anticipation of our destiny.

How we live determines our destiny. Gaudete Sunday shifts the focus to Jesus' coming mysteriously into our lives. Our relationship with Jesus keeps us tethered to our identity and shapes our behaviour. If our identity is corrupted, our relationship with Jesus needs an autopsy. John the Baptist is great because he is defined by a sublime relationship with the living God in Jesus Christ. He is defined by a relationship with love. That means like John the Baptist, we are extraordinary - if that is what defines us. Advent is a new beginning and a new conversion. Look into our hearts: What do I relate to? What is important to me? Am I in love with Jesus? Do I see Jesus in all things and in all relationships? Do I see

God's plan and salvation in all things?

Last week, we saw the importance of repentance and reconciliation. Gaudete Sunday exhorts us to take the next step: "the proclamation of the Gospel and to active charity." (CCC 1070) It is in touching lives that we experience the Advent joy of living out our identity through God's love and mercy. We need the grace of the Holy Spirit, in contemplation and prayer, to discern and bring to life, the gifts of God in us. Then only will our love bring joy and hope to those in need. When prayer-life penetrates lived-life, the relationship with Jesus becomes lifegiving to both giver and receiver. When we touch lives, we heal ourselves too. "It is in giving that we receive" (St. Francis of Assisi). We shall see goodness, beauty & truth in everything and rejoice in all that is God. Equally important; discovering and nurturing our charisms through active charity is easier and more effective in driving out vices, than struggling with them in perpetual confessions and despair. This is because the two cannot go together. Such is the counterintuitive wisdom of God; his yoke is easy and his burden light (Mt 11:30). Evil is the absence of good, as darkness is the absence of light. Jesus warns that one must be not only emptied of evil but filled with divine goodness - otherwise we land ourselves in a state "worse than the first" (Lk 11:24-26). In today's

Gospel, John the Baptist's preaching moves in the same trajectory, from repentance to social justice (Lk 3:11, 14), honesty (Lk 3:13), and generosity (Lk 3:11); (cf CCC 2447). Our vices are screaming for redemption. Give it an outlet through works of charity this Advent and Christmas.

Only God and his holy will can fill the void in our hearts. Desire and faith are the only prerequisites. Do not be caught off-guard like the foolish bridesmaids - it will be too late when Jesus finally comes again: "Truly, I say to you, I do not know you" (Mt 25:11-12). Have a personal relationship with Jesus now. John the Baptist was not the light but speaks for the light. If we are dim, rededicate ourselves to Jesus; bright but legalistic like the Pharisees, it is carcinogenic and realignment is urgently needed. We must shine brightly with the love, compassion and kindness of Jesus that is attractive and life-giving. Look beyond secular labels of who we are. Rejoice in our transcendental identity and relationship with the living God. It is the ticket to immortality; priceless, but free.



ADVENT PRAYER TREE




Lectio: Prayer — An Intimate Dialogue
