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# **Emmanuel: Love Made Manifest**

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord 2 Jan 2022

Is 60:1-6 Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6 Mt 2:1-12

Do you look up at the night sky wondering what the "Jesus star" looks like? The wise men in today's gospel said they saw "his star as it rose." (Mt 2:2) Jesus himself said that "signs in the sun, moon, and the stars" will accompany his coming (Lk 21:25). What would you do if you came across an unusual star? The magi knew they had to pursue the star - travel far, over field, fountain, moor and mountain as we sing in the hymn "We Three Kings." But how did these gentile wise men come to know of the birth of Jesus? What is the significance of this feast that we are celebrating today?

Some answers can be found by first looking at the meaning of the word Epiphany. Meaning manifestation, it is derived from Greek roots meaning "to show, to display". So what is being manifested? CCC 528, states that, "the Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the lordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee." In this feast we see the beginning of the revelation of God's unfolding plan of salvation for his people. The nuance of the significance of Epiphany is in the magi's search for the Jewish King, "Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Saviour of the world only by turning towards

the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament." (CCC528) God is truly Emmanuel - with his people, those who know him and those who seek

It is remarkable that these gentiles from different nations were able to receive the prophecy of the new King of the Jews. In his book, Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives, Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI explored the identity of the magi and how they came to know of Jesus' birth. Traditionally thought to be from the Persian priestly caste, the magi would have been well-versed in philosophy astronomy, and used these means to seek truth. Church tradition has expanded upon the backgrounds of the wise men to originate from varied age profiles and regions to highlight the universality of Jesus' invitation. The magi's visit then also illuminates how the search for truth in nature and religion ultimately leads to Jesus through a determined seeking with open hearts. As Pope Emeritus remarked, this story "represent(s) the inner aspiration of the human spirit, the dynamism of religions and human reason toward him."

What sets these wise men apart from their contemporaries, evident in their juxtaposition to King Herod, is their persistent search and openness

with which to receive the truth. After meeting Jesus, they allowed God to direct their plans, not returning by the same way. Similarly, in our own journeys, are we in pursuit of truth, of Jesus? Have we been open and engaged with him during Christmas? Pope Francis, in his Epiphany homily in 2019, highlights Isaiah's invitation for us to arise (60:1), "to get up from our sedentary lives and prepare for a journey", putting aside our pretences to be aware of the star that the Lord has placed in our lives, that leads us to our king.

What have been our dispositions to receiving our infant king? Are we overwhelmed with joy, as the wise men were (Mt 2:10)? Do we pay our Lord homage that he is due? The wise men were struck with awe and adoration as they came into his presence, as Pope Francis notes, "bow(ing) down before the One who is the centre". The magi become a guide for us then, on how to approach and greet the newborn king before us. Just as they presented gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh, what gifts do we bring before our Lord? He does not desire material things but something even more valuable, the gift of ourselves. As we give of ourselves, he gives us something even better, his infinite love which we receive at every Mass in the Eucharist. What is our answer to him?

## **MODULE 1 OF MY PERSONAL MORAL COMPASS 2022**


