Why Fast?

1st Sunday of Lent 6 Mar 2022

Deut 26:4-10 Rom 10:8-13 Lk 4:1-13

We enter into the first Sunday of Lent by hearing once again the account from St. Luke of Jesus being led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness to do battle with the devil. All three of the Synoptic Gospels tell us that this battle took place over the course of 40 days during which Jesus also fasted.

The number forty in the Bible is always symbolic of a period of testing and training. Thus, God rained on earth for 40 days to cleanse it after telling Noah to enter the ark (Gen 7:4); the tribes of Israel were made to wander for 40 years in the desert because they disobeyed God (Num 14:34); for their disobedience to God, Israel was given over to oppression by the Philistines for 40 years (Jdg 13:1); Elijah, after eating angelic cake, walked for 40 days and 40 nights to Mount Horeb where he spoke with God; and the great city of Nineveh was given 40 days to repent or face destruction from God for their wickedness. Likewise, our Lord Jesus submitted himself to being tested for 40 days in the wilderness.

In allowing himself to be tested by the devil in the wilderness, Jesus "recapitulated the temptations of Adam in Paradise and of Israel in the desert". This mysterious event has salvific meaning. Where the first Adam gave in to temptation, Jesus, the new Adam, remained faithful in total obedience to the divine will, revealing himself to be God's Servant

(CCC538-539). Jesus showed us that the way to overcome temptation is to order our lives to worship and serve God alone, trusting in His goodness and providence, and nourishing our souls not just by the material bread that we eat, but by spiritual bread which is every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. (Deut 8:3)

But why did Jesus have to fast for 40 days and 40 nights? Firstly, consider that humanity's fall from grace and into sin began with eating. God gave every tree to Adam for food but forbade him from eating of just one tree (Gen 2:16-17). Adam and Eve broke the "fast" by eating of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, not because it is a means to life, but believing that food had life in itself and thus he could be "like God" (Gen 3:5). In breaking the fast from what is forbidden, Adam had the mistaken belief that "bread alone" is all that is needed to live. Jesus, being the new Adam, fasted for 40 days and became hungry. Such hunger would force us to confront the ultimate question - "what does my life truly depend upon?" The devil tempted both Adam and Jesus -Eat, because hunger proves that you depend on food to live, your life is in food. Adam believed the devil rather than trust in God and ate. Jesus said

"Man does not live by bread alone" (Lk 4:4), "but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." (Mt 4:4, Deut 8:3) Faith in God frees us from total dependence on food, on matter and any other worldly things. Jesus fasted for 40 days to show us that the only way for us to recover our true spiritual nature is to fast, because fasting restrains our desires of the flesh which builds self-control and self-mastery, allowing the spirit to bring the flesh under control (cf Gal 5:17). This then raises our mind and heart to heavenly things, toward the contemplation of God, purifying the desires and aspirations of our souls towards the beauty and truth of God.

In order for fasting to be effective, the spirit must be an integral part of it - Christian fasting is not about losing weight. Fasting is about our spiritual life and prayer because it is ultimately about fasting from sin. It is a real fight between good and evil, and very likely we will fail many times, but through prayer and supplications to God, we learn to depend on God for the grace of faith and strength from the Eucharist - the truest of foods, to help us persevere in our fast from sin.


